God Would; We Would Not

March 13, 2022

AS WE GATHER

The theme of Lent is repentance. Today, we are given a prophet's story of warning against a people who refused His mercy. But it is not the only story. The Lord still invites us to find a refuge in the wings of His mercy and, to all who will receive Him and believe on His name, there is no limit to His grace. The Lord is determined to go to the cross for us and to bestow upon us all the treasures of His grace, but the path that leads to Christ is the way of repentance and faith. We pray that the Holy Spirit will work in our hearts so that we may not refuse the Lord's invitation and may rejoice in the wings of His mercy forevermore.



PRAYER

Lord, I love the habitation of Your house and the place where Your glory dwells. In the multitude of Your tender mercies prepare my heart that I may enter Your house to worship and confess Your holy name; through Jesus Christ, my God and Lord.

CHRISTIAN QUESTIONS WITH THEIR ANSWERS

After confession and instruction in the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper, the pastor may ask, or Christians may ask themselves these questions:

P *1. Do you believe that you are a sinner?*

C **Yes, I believe it. I am a sinner.**

P *2. How do you know this?*

C **From the Ten Commandments, which I have not kept.**

P *3. Are you sorry for your sins?*

C **Yes, I am sorry that I have sinned against God.**

P *4. What have you deserved from God because of your sins?*

C **His wrath and displeasure, temporal death, and eternal damnation. See Romans 6:21, 23.**

P *5. Do you hope to be saved?*

C **Yes, that is my hope.**

P *6. In whom then do you trust?*

C **In my dear Lord Jesus Christ.**

P *7. Who is Christ?*

C **The Son of God, true God and man.**

- P *8. How many Gods are there?*
 C **Only one, but there are three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.**
- P *9. What has Christ done for you that you trust in Him?*
 C **He died for me and shed His blood for me on the cross for the forgiveness of sins.**
- P *10. Did the Father also die for you?*
 C **He did not. The Father is God only, as is the Holy Spirit; but the Son is both true God and true man. He died for me and shed His blood for me.**
- P *11. How do you know this?*
 C **From the Holy Gospel, from the words instituting the Sacrament, and by His body and blood given me as a pledge in the Sacrament.**
- P *12. What are the Words of Institution?*
 C **Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me." In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."**
- P *13. Do you believe, then, that the true body and blood of Christ are in the Sacrament?*
 C **Yes, I believe it.**
- P *14. What convinces you to believe this?*
 C **The word of Christ: Take, eat, this is My body; drink of it, all of you, this is My blood.**
- P *15. What should we do when we eat His body and drink His blood, and in this way receive His pledge?*
 C **We should remember and proclaim His death and the shedding of His blood, as He taught us: This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.**
- P *16. Why should we remember and proclaim His death?*
 C **First, so we may learn to believe that no creature could make satisfaction for our sins. Only Christ, true God and man, could do that. Second, so we may learn to be horrified by our sins, and to regard them as very serious. Third, so we may find joy and comfort in Christ alone, and through faith in Him be saved.**
- P *17. What motivated Christ to die and make full payment for your sins?*
 C **His great love for His Father and for me and other sinners, as it is written in John 14; Romans 5; Galatians 2; and Ephesians 5.**
- P *18. Finally, why do you wish to go to the Sacrament?*

C **That I may learn to believe that Christ, out of great love, died for my sin, and also learn from Him to love God and my neighbor.**

P *19. What should admonish and encourage a Christian to receive the Sacrament frequently?*

C **First, both the command and the promise of Christ the Lord. Second, his own pressing need, because of which the command, encouragement, and promise are given.**

P *20. But what should you do if you are not aware of this need and have no hunger and thirst for the Sacrament?*

C **To such a person no better advice can be given than this: first, he should touch his body to see if he still has flesh and blood. Then he should believe what the Scriptures say of it in Galatians 5 and Romans 7. Second, he should look around to see whether he is still in the world, and remember that there will be no lack of sin and trouble, as the Scriptures say in John 15–16 and in 1 John 2 and 5. Third, he will certainly have the devil also around him, who with his lying and murdering day and night will let him have no peace, within or without, as the Scriptures picture him in John 8 and 16; 1 Peter 5; Ephesians 6; and 2 Timothy 2.**

NOTE

These questions and answers are no child's play, but are drawn up with great earnestness of purpose by the venerable and devout Dr. Luther for both young and old. Let each one pay attention and consider it a serious matter; for St. Paul writes to the Galatians in chapter six: "Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked."

OLD TESTAMENT READING *Jeremiah 26:8–15*

⁸When Jeremiah had finished speaking all that the LORD had commanded him to speak to all the people, then the priests and the prophets and all the people laid hold of him, saying, “You shall die!” ⁹Why have you prophesied in the name of the LORD, saying, “This house shall be like Shiloh, and this city shall be desolate, without inhabitant?” And all the people gathered around Jeremiah in the house of the LORD.

¹⁰When the officials of Judah heard these things, they came up from the king’s house to the house of the LORD and took their seat in the entry of the New Gate of the house of the LORD.

SERMON *“The Comfort of Dual Citizenship”* Philippians 3:17—4:1

Introduction:

“I’m But a Stranger Here. Heaven is My Home” is one of the most beautiful lines written and song by Christians. It is so true and so important to us today as it has been throughout our whole life.

I. On Earth

We are citizen of this world, this earth. We can't escape it. We may try. We may bury our heads in denying all that is going on. We may be tempted to think it is not our problem. Let others resolve it. Yet, we are affected by the events and actions of others in this world as they are affected by our thought, words and deeds. We are a part of this world. And under the command of God, we are to take care of His creation.

So we do concern ourselves about the war in Ukraine and other parts of the world. We do concern ourselves about the misuse of natural resources and over consumption. We do concern ourselves about the living conditions of all nations, not only in shelter but also the conditions of living under oppression of any type. We do concern ourselves about things that are beyond our control. In doing so, we do not want to become enemies of Christ.

Paul writes to the Christians in Philippi about the false teachers and prophets who claim to speak for God. They come with teachings and philosophies that tickle the ears of the hearers. They proclaim earthly blessings and prosperity if one just does follows their teachings. They teach and preach in order to fill their bellies' and enjoy the riches of the earth.

These are the most obvious enemies of Christ. Their teachings undermine and destroy the faith, the trust people have in Christ. And we examine ourselves to see where we have thought, acted or spoken as enemies of Christ.

Yes, our sinful nature continues to rebel against Christ. We are concerned about the troubles of this world, but we want Christ to fix them so that we can have a peaceful and better life here on earth. We are concern about our own wealth rather than the souls of others. This sinful flesh seeks its own good and clings to this world as if it is our forever home.

We are tempted to reject sound and good doctrine that benefits us and keeps us in the one true faith for glory and honor on earth. We seek glory and honor for our children while settling for false doctrines and practices that harm our children's faith. We want what is good for our families and ourselves here on earth rather than the good and salvation Christ has prepared and given to us.

II. In Heaven

We confess our sins for swallow thankfulness, for seeking the good for others only to make our earthly life better. We forget that we are but strangers here and heaven is our home.

We do not use our faith and belief in Christ to bury our heads and hide from all the troubles of this world. We do not isolate ourselves from others. We seek to help others, ease their suffering and encourage them to stay true to Christ. For the troubles of this world are temporary. This life on earth is temporary. This world will come to an end.

Our forever home is in heaven. It is a placed already prepared for us. It is secured and paid in full by Christ's death and resurrection. There will be no wars there. There will be no

destruction of property or misuse of natural resources. There will be no more tears, sorrows, sickness and death. Sin will not be a part of our lives in heaven.

We hold fast to this hope not as to blind us to the difficulties of this life. Rather, as a foundation in dealing and living in this world.

My father told me this about summer jobs. "You can work any job as long as you know you are going back to school in the fall." We face any troubles, sorrows and difficulties on earth knowing that we will be heaven someday.

Conclusion:

So, we go forth and actively serve God and our neighbor. We fight for justice. We seek to relief hunger, thirst and homelessness. We seek to train our children up in the right understanding of the teachings of Christ. We call on Christ to help us in temporal affairs. But above all we can call on Him to keep us in the one true faith till life everlasting.
