"The Year There Wasn't Easter"

2020 will be remembered for the coronavirus pandemic and the effects it had upon our congregation. Early on, Easter Divine Services were cancelled including Holy Week Divine Services. It wouldn't be until June that small groups could gather for Word and Sacrament.

During that period, individuals and families came to the church to receive the Lord's Supper. The Word was proclaimed now through social media. Sermons, Bible Studies, Sunday School lessons and announcements were posted on our website and Emailed. We began to publish the message and place a video devotion on Facebook. This allowed us to reach our members and many others.

As the year comes to a close, we saw more people beginning to gather for Word and Sacrament. Christmas services were held over a three day period. The first was the silent service held on Wednesday night. There were the two "candlelight" Christmas Eve service. The candles were cell phones and battery run candles. And Christmas morning completed the Christmas celebration.

Late in fall, a silent service was put in place on Wednesday nights. This service was a Word and Sacrament service with no singing. This was established due to the advice of the health department discouraging singing when in groups. Our Saturday night and Sunday morning Divine Services continue to provide music and singing. The participants kept their masks on during the service.

Yes, masks and safe distancing is now the practice in the congregation. This has caused us to limit the number of participants in the service. At the time of this writing, the limit is 25. As more vaccinations become available in this new year, we may see this limit increase to include more. Until that time, we will continue to increase the number of opportunities to gather around the Word and the Sacrament of the Altar.

The toll of the virus upon the congregation is seen in the isolation so many have to practice, the quarantining of those being infected or coming in contact with others infected, and the death of members, family members and friends. This has been especially hard due to the fact that funeral homes have had to limit the number of people who may attend the service. Private graveside services have become the norm for the time being.

When this pandemic will end is in the hands of a good and gracious God. His Word continues to reach our hearts. His Holy Spirit has worked to keep us even amid such obstacles and distractions in the one true faith till life everlasting. He will deliver us He has promised. For now, the strengthening of faith is truly needed. Our prayers are that this pandemic comes to end either by cure or by the return of Christ. And ultimately, Christ will deliver us to our heavenly home where there is no more sickness, sorrows, grief, sin and death. To God be the glory now and forever. *Pastor Blomquist*

Preschool

We began the new 2020 year in January with a class size for the 3 y.o. class at seven students, and the 4 y.o. class size at nine students. Additionally, preschool enrollment for the next school year of 2020 -2021 opened up to the public this month. Prior to returning to school in January, new carpeting was installed in the main classroom over Christmas break which the students realized right away. And a new game, Banana Blast, was gifted to the students which made them very happy.

January studies included alphabet work, numbers, money, shapes, health and months of the year. We continued practice of writing our names. Art class covered some scissor skills, winter creations, and a Martin Luther King Jr. coloring sheet. We also had a lesson on sequencing, read some books, and practiced our sight words. During chapel and Bible time, we learned about Jesus' miracles, Noah's ark and sang "Jesus Loves Me".

February we celebrated a birthday and Valentine's Day with some birthday treats, and a Valentine's class party. During Art the students decorated hats and mittens, and created heart inspired artwork. They even made special bags for their Valentine's Day exchange. Valentine cards were made by the students, and distributed to Taylorville Estates. They have really been enjoying their time together playing High Ho Cherry-O, dress up, and lace and trace puzzles.

March work continued on mastering their alphabet letters with many worksheets, and watching *Letter Factory*. The children enjoyed hearing stories like *Can I have a Hug*, and verses from the Bible. The students worked on their numbers counting by 5's and 10's, practiced their months of the year song, and completed a George Washington worksheet. We also worked on sight words, the Money Poem and a shamrock seek and find alphabet page. The children enjoyed making salt letters and numbers. This unique finger work allows the children to have a sensory experience while drawing the letters/numbers into a shallow dish of salt. To understand this, think of a homemade Etch a Sketch, and you can get the idea. A brand new doll house was gifted to the class which was quite a hit a playtime. Other activities included scissor skills, water color art and play dough. The remainder of March school and the planned field trip to the Olde Bowle all came to a complete halt when the COVID pandemic struck.

Fortunately the students made it to the end of their alphabet studies when school abruptly ended in March. March, April and May assignments became packets of worksheets which were distributed by staff through drive through pick ups. Also, these packets were made available online. Part of the curriculum was recorded and put on our private Facebook group including Pastor's chapel visits. Even class birthday celebrations went onto our private Facebook group. Courtney and Nathan Books helped Mrs. Books bring some life into our recorded lessons which also made them more entertaining. In addition, Bobby and Zippy (puppets) also known as our class mascots, participated in the recordings. The recordings could never replace the in class learning experience, but we tried our best. The nice thing about it was that students could choose

to watch these recordings whenever, and as often as they liked. The class even did a live Zoom call just for fun.

May tuition was waived, and graduation service was postponed due to the epidemic. A drive through pick up was held for retrieval of student's end of year books and belongings.

May is usually a time the school staff does inventory and planning. However, staff worked on prepping the main classroom for a new paint job. The blue sticky tack came down and walls were cleaned. A work proposal was submitted to the Board of Directors. Over the summer break, operations staff completed painting the main classroom. They did a great job and even painted the doors with green chalkboard paint. Our operations staff also hung new curtains in both classrooms.

A small graduation service was held the first Sunday in August. Upon returning to school, staff hosted a 2020 - 2021 school orientation at the end August. Parents were encouraged to come alone due to COVID restrictions. The parents brought in many school supplies. The first week of September was just staff. Bulletin board decorations were donated and hung in the main classroom. Staff prepped their freshly painted classroom, and eagerly prepared for the return of students.

September 8, 2020 was the first day with students. At the beginning of the new school year, we began with 4 students enrolled in the 4 y.o. class and 5 students enrolled in the 5 y.o. class. Staff made the decision to use the main classroom only even for chapel. The thought process was that one classroom would be easier to sanitize. And the main classroom is bigger allowing the students to be able to maintain a safer distance. The other classroom is being used for an overflow storage for school until regulations are lifted.

In September, the class heard Pastor speak about Creation, and we prayed, sang and read from the Bible. We studied the alphabet and our numbers. The students were able to get some fun in the sun too. We went outdoors to play Red Rover and Duck Duck Goose. In addition, our class did arts and crafts, and practiced writing their names. Students started to make their own alphabet books. They are learning by tracing their numbers and letters. Many apple and acorn themed work/coloring sheets and art projects were completed. An apple tasting was held to determine which apples the children liked best. Also, the students have been reciting the Pledge of Allegiance daily. Fun games helped the children learn about shapes, body parts, opposites, and counting too. We also did some sight word work and scissor skills.

October blessed us with a new student in the 3 year old class making the total number of students in that class six. We enjoyed many warm days which allowed students to get outdoor activity time. They also worked on alphabet letters E - H. They used daubers and magnets to help learn their letters. They played with puppets, did lots of coloring pages, and read some stories. Other studies included, shapes and colors, work on numbers, and body bingo. During art the class made bottle dolls to look like themselves, but dressed the dolls in Biblical attire. Lots of art

work required students to use scissors and glue. Crafts like pumpkins, ghosts, spiders and cats were made. Fun Photo took class pictures. The month finished out with Halloween parties and parent/teacher conferences. They had lots of treats at their parties. Parents provided positive responses in regards to the return of in-person instruction.

November work continued with instruction of letters I - L, our names and numbers. We even managed of few more days of outdoor play. We celebrated some birthdays and Veterans Day. We did a cool pizza math worksheet where we got to cut, glue and count pizza slices. We made scarecrows, turkeys, flag pictures, cornucopias and play dough alphabet letters. We elected Zippy to be our class mascot. We played with Mr. Potato Head, and built tall towers with Legos at center time. We did a pie taste testing just because you can never have too much pie.

December we focused our learning about the birth of Jesus, letters M - O, numbers 9 and 14, and shapes. We also regularly practiced our name pages and numbers. During Art we made Christmas stockings, worked on lots of great holiday coloring pages, Christmas wreathes, and even painted with cookie cutters. The children made letters to Santa, and snowmen to give as gifts. The class Christmas parties were really fun with an indoor snowball (not real) toss, a reindeer ring toss, and a pin the nose on Rudolph game with fun prizes. We sang Christmas songs by the Christmas tree, and ate special treats. They made crafts, opened some early Christmas presents (which were some new toys donated to school), and wore pajamas to school. No Christmas program was held this year due to the COVID restrictions. The students collected paper goods during the month of December which were donated to the Shadow Home.

CHILDCARE*PLUS*

The year started out with somewhat low enrollment, and it had increased by March when we had to suddenly close due to the pandemic.

The week we closed many families had already been told to go home and work from home. Monday that week we had twenty children in attendance, Tuesday we had ten in attendance and by Wednesday March 18, we had six children in the entire building and three of those were from one family. On Friday night the Governor had mandated all closures. We made the best decision.

We remained closed and staff had workdays one day of each week. We deep cleaned and painted much of the center over the course of March to mid-June. We successfully reopened Monday June 22, 2020. We could have up to ten children per classroom and prioritized single parents and families that were returning to work after a long three months of the pandemic.

We have been successful and only had one staff and one volunteer that have had the Covid 19 virus. Staff has taken pride in cleaning their own classrooms through this process, and visitors are still not allowed in the building. Temp checks have been running smoothly at drop off and

we have the process as fine tuned as we can have. Moving through the winter we have had a few families lose their jobs and move out of Illinois.

Enrollment stays steady, and we average 53 children six weeks to six years old. We have been assisting the kindergarten children with virtual learning all school year and that has been a blessing to many families.

We continue to clean and wash toys throughout every day. This includes all door handles and commonly touched surfaces.

We applied for the Child Care Restoration Grant and was awarded a grant for the months of July, August, September, October, November and December

We continue to have a waiting list. With the current staffing crisis, we are at our limit on enrollment unless God blesses me with new teachers that meet DCFS requirements.

We are down to 17 contributors \odot we have a balance of \$1451.22. I pay \$ 336.00 per child (4) quarterly. I also give \$25.00 for each child's Birthday and Christmas. I do pay that the first of the year because there is a \$3.50 service charge for each gift but only one for all if I pay at one time. They send Birthday and Christmas gifts out a month prior to occasion. I pray I don't have to stop that. At the end of the year if I don't get any more donations I will have \$117.22 in our account. I continue to send letters to past donors. Last year there were 25 contributors and the year before 30. We slowly decrease every year. I have contacted Childfund asking they don't automatically replace child. If child becomes of age, moves away or various reasons they usually replace. Due to our funding we may have to decrease our support, I don't have the heart to ask them to remove one. I play it year by year, and this past year has been tough for many. Prayers are appreciated! MISSIONS FOR TAYLORVILLE (TORNADO) 2018 -2020

It was a dark and stormy night. . .

And so begins what was to become a disastrous evening for many of the residents of the City of Taylorville. The tornado that ripped through Christian County on December 1st, 2018, left a wake of destruction that had never experienced by its' residents and many prayers went up that they would never see anything like it again.

Clean up and rebuilding started immediately, with neighbor helping neighbor, and donations of cash and materials started flowing in from around the country. An entity was needed to collect and distribute this relief effort, one that could start moving the assistance to those in need immediately. Fortunately, just such an organization existed in the city in the form of Missions For Taylorville. This organization had already been providing residents with assistance in repairing their homes during their semi-annual Missions For Taylorville Work Days. These work day Saturdays paired up those in need with volunteer laborers and donated materials to complete home repair and maintenance jobs.

But even this group had never been inundated with such a huge number of individuals in need and large number of homes with massive destruction, some being entirely destroyed. We stepped up to the challenge and worked many late nights and weekend to ensure that a process

was created to fairly and equitably distribute the materials and funds that had been received, as well as, create a clearing house for volunteers from around the country, eager to come and help. Many of the Missions board members also put sweat equity into the projects as well, working alongside home owners, other volunteers and local contractors.

After almost two years, the projects are drawing to a close, donations have dried up and volunteers have been curtailed by a new disaster called Covid-19. Through it all, Missions For Taylorville has been able to offer assistance to almost 200 families, distributing over \$870,000 in funds and materials to complete jobs such as replacing siding, windows and roofs all the way up to several complete houses. In one instance we even coordinated and worked on moving an entire house, donated by a local individual, to replace a home totally destroyed by the tornado.

Now that the projects are reaching completion and the funds and materials have all been distributed, the weekly, sometimes bi-weekly, meetings are winding down and the Missions Board member are looking forward to a little "relief" of their own, relief from the massive project that they undertook and praying, along with all of Taylorville, that they'll never experienced anything like it again.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES' RULES FOR USE OF THE CHURCH JANUARY 2000

1. NO SMOKING ANYWHERE IN THE CHURCH BUILDING.

- 2. All tables and chairs used must be put back in their proper place. There is a diagram of that placement attached to the custodian's closet door located in the basement which will show you how to put the chairs and tables back in their proper order.
- 3. All extra chairs that are not placed at the tables must be folded and put back on the moveable chair rack which is located under the basement stairs located next to the church secretary's office.
- 4. All decorations used for a function must be removed.
- 5. All tables must be washed and wiped clean, and debris removed from underneath
- 6. The floors should be swept, or mopped in case of spilled items. Brooms and mops can be found in the custodian's closet.
- 7. All trash should be placed into large trash containers located in the church kitchen. Extra trash liners are located in the custodian's closet.
- 8. All bathrooms should be checked before you leave the church. Stools should be flushed and all water faucets in layatories turned off.
- 9. The church should be checked to make sure all lights are turned off and all windows and doors closed.
- 10. No Food or Drink Items should be taken anywhere upstairs in the church, but should remain in the basement Fellowship Hall or kitchen area.
- 11. Bicycles should not be parked or ridden upon the entranceway carpet.
- 12. All organizations, groups, individuals, etc., should check the Master Church Calendar located in the church secretary's office for the availability of the date that you wish for your activity something may already be scheduled on the Master Calendar. This also applies when canceling a date on the calendar please contact the church office and have your activity date removed.
- 13. People who have private dinners or receptions and use the church facilities, the above request for usage applies. There is a \$100 fee for using the Fellowship Hall and kitchen for wedding receptions; as well as a \$100 fee for the sanctuary for a wedding; payable in advance. This is payable to the custodian,

because of the extra cleanup involved. [NO fee for members wishing to use basement for birthday, anniversary and baby showers]

- 14. All children must be accompanied by an adult at all times, for any function within the church. Also, no children are to be in the balcony area without adult supervision.
- 15. Finally, all doors must be locked before you leave.
- 16. If any problems arise while you are in the church, please contact any of the following <u>Trustees</u>

THE ORGANIST SCHOLARSHIP FUND:

- 1. A member of the congregation
- 2. The congregation pays the teacher after the student submits a voucher for payment.
- 3. The student will write a short essay explaining their life goals and their intentions in taking lessons. Essay to be submitted to the Board of Elders.
- 4. The congregation will also pay our seminaries an appropriate fee to them for any of our student organists to take lessons at either seminary in order that they gain a Lutheran understanding of liturgy.
- 5. Where the student fails to attend the lesson. The student will pay for that lesson.
- 6. Funding for the student shall be on a funds available status
- 7. The entire matter shall be renewed or not on annual basis.
- 8. The congregation shall retain the right to alter this matter as needed.

TRINITY LUTHERAN MEMORIAL FUNDS

(*Updated 2016*)

1. Church Improvement Projects

Funds from this account are used for church improvement projects, equipment, or major repairs in the church.

2. Books

Funds from this account are used to purchase new hymnals and bibles for the church.

3. Undesignated Fund

Funds in the general memorial fund are used for projects approved by the church board of directors.

4. Scholarship Fund

Funds in this account are for anyone attending a church sponsored school.

5. Organist Scholarship Fund

Funds in this account are for members of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod who desire to become a church organist in our church body.

6. Building Fund

Funds in this account are to be used for building addition(s) and for retirement of any mortgage(s).

7. Needy Fund (Good Samaritan Fund)

Funds in this account are for Pastor's use in assisting needy people in an emergency situation. It can also be used by members of the congregation to gather funds to help a family member or a neighbor in need. With Elder's approval, this should be done for a short amount of time, for example: a month or 6 weeks. The funds should go to meet a need such as rent or medical expense.

Memorial Funds should be designated before the church can receive the funds.

If the family would like the memorial funds used for a "special project" that is not mentioned above, please notify the Pastor. At that time, the Pastor will inform the Treasurer and the Trustees of the pending project. These "special projects" must be fully funded by the memorial received. In this instance, the memorial funds should not be forwarded to the church until the project is identified by the family and agreed to by the Trustees and/or Board of Directors.

We hope that this information will be of help to you in making a decision regarding your tribute to your loved one's memory.
