For Advent 1: November 29, 2020

Imagine the scene at a convention of demons. All of them would bring ideas to trick, tempt, and mislead people. For they want to drag with them down the eternal drain as many of us as possible!

One might say, "Let's tempt people with money." Another might say, "We'll get them to crave power." Still another might offer, "Sensual and sexual stuff can prove very alluring."

What about God and His Word? "Let's cast doubt on what the Bible says about our existence," a demon might suggest. "If people don't think we are real, they'll let their guard down." Another could say, "Well, let's raise doubts about many teachings of the Bible." Another could add, "Why stop there? Let's set people to wondering whether there can be any such thing as truth!"

The suggestions could come faster and faster, so rapidly that the secretary of the meeting hardly keeps track of them all. Finally, Satan himself might contribute the crowning idea. "We can do all that," he could say, "but we should concentrate our greatest effort on one point."

What point? "Let's convince people that these matters can all wait. They have plenty of time."

Sunday begins the church year season of Advent, which anticipates the coming of Christ. During Advent, Christians pray in effect, "Great God, interrupt us."

In words to be read at our church service on Sunday, the prophet Isaiah asked the Lord to "rend the heavens and come down . . . and remember not iniquity forever." For those with faith in Christ as Savior, this is nothing to fear. St. Paul wrote that God "will sustain you to the end, guiltless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Jesus interrupts us now through His Word, and at length by His coming again. Maybe today!

As We Gather

The Church Year begins by taking us to the scene of our Lord's final entry into Jerusalem that great and holy week. Yes, Christmas is at hand. Surely the preparations for the celebration of His incarnation, His earthly birth of the Virgin Mary, are already well under way. But wait a moment. We enter this new year already knowing why He became incarnate of the Holy Spirit for us and for our salvation, which is only by way of His passion, death, and resurrection. We begin by continuing to "wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ" on the Last Day (1 Corinthians 1:7), sustained by Him now in



the forgiveness of our sins, guiltless and ready. In readiness, we boldly pray that our Lord comes to rescue and save us.

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Sermon "The King Cometh" Mark 11:1–10

Introduction:

Christ the king is not a tale of a servant becoming a king. It is not how a humble man won the love of the people and in turn they made Him their king. It is an account of how Christ our King is our Savior.

I. His first entrance was as a humble servant

When He entered into Jerusalem, it wasn't to become the King of Israel. He is the Son of God. He is the Son of David. He comes from a line of kings in Israel. He was not there to claim His birth right as king. Though what He did before the week was over was as heroic, and even more so than any earthly king could accomplish.

Christ entered Jerusalem as a humble servant. He was there to serve both the Father and us. He came as one who was to carry out a task that would bring salvation to the world.

And that task was to suffer the wrath of God in our place. It was to offer His life in our place as payment for the sins of the world. It was to be buried and then rise again on the third day, fulfilling Scriptures. This way He has secured for us the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation. And for His Father, He reconciled Him to us so that He could and will accept us as His Children.

The people who welcomed Jesus as King were right. They did not chant, "Make Him King." They acknowledged Him as King. And some day we will get to acknowledge Him as King in His presence.

II. His next arrival will be as an exalted King

Christ will come again. It is not to establish Himself as King. That He did when He was on earth. The Father had Him ascend into heaven to sit at His right hand. All authority has been place under His rule, His reign. He is our King today.

And now we await His return. We do want to see our King with our own eyes. And when He comes again, He will still serve the Father in heaven and us. He will raise the dead, judge the living and the dead, and gather all the Children of God into His presence and deliver us to the Father in heaven and to our eternal home.

The celebration will not stop. There will be no suffering and death after He comes. There will be no to no one oppose Him. There will not be enemies of our faith in Christ to attack us. We will be safe and sound in the presence of our King. There will be peace, an everlasting peace.

Conclusion:

The account Christ being King is not a rag to riches tale. It is not an inspiring story of how we can go from humble beginnings to making it big. It is not a historical recording of a man born in a log cabin and becoming President of the United States.

It is the account of how our King is our Savior. And we pray that God would keep us in the one true faith till life everlasting so that we may welcome our King and live in His kingdom now and forever.
