AS WE GATHER

Advent is a season for us to grow in hope. We gather amid a world that in many ways seems hopeless. Extremists on both ends of the political spectrum seem to control almost everything we hear, read, and see. Deep divisions over race, politics, and economics loom over us like a dark storm cloud. How can the Church possibly make a difference in all of this? Today's Readings acknowledge the distress and fear that the world's foundations are being shaken. And right in the middle of it all, there is hope. Jesus says, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away" (Luke 21:33). The prophet Jeremiah declares God's promise to restore His people and all creation. If we were left to ourselves, there would be little room for such hope. But God does not leave us alone. By His Word and Sacraments, God establishes our hearts and prepares us for Jesus' coming final restoration. Until that day, we wait, we pray, we hope.

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SERMON “We Have Heard”¹ Thessalonians 3:9-13

Introduction:

Have you experienced the joyous sensation of seeing someone arrive safely to their home? It may have been a loved one who returned home from war. It may have been a family member who arrived in spite of the blizzard roaring outside. There is a sense of relief and ecstatic joy. There may even have been screams of delight and bear hugs.

If you have, you may now understand the joy and delight that Paul had when he heard that the Christians in Thessalonica had remain faithful to Christ in spite of the persecution they had faced.

I. Thanksgiving

Paul states that he can't even begin to give all the thanks and praise God deserves. He knew it was the Father's grace through His Son, Jesus Christ which kept them in the one true faith. He knew it was not their strength of character that held them firm in faith in Christ. He knew it wasn't their deep commitment that helped them resist the dangers that pressed against their faith.

Paul knew this was the work of the Holy Spirit who creates and sustains the faith of the believer in Christ Jesus. This is why his thanksgiving is point solely to the Lord. Paul knew the weakness of the flesh and also the power of the Holy Spirit to hold one steadfast in faith. He knew this, for he had gone through severe persecution. He knew that it was only by the grace of God and His strength that has kept him in the one true faith.

And this is true for you and me. You and I have been kept in the one true faith till life everlasting because of the work of the Holy Spirit in and through the Word and the Sacraments. We face many an obstacle to our faith in Christ. It may come in the form of pressure to be like the world around us. It may come as distractions that draw us away from the Word and the Sacraments. It may come from within ourselves who want to rule our own thoughts, words and deeds. It may come from a false belief that says, “I know all this. What need do I have to hear His Word or receive His Sacraments?”

II. The Desire that All Remain Faithful till the Coming of the Lord

Paul answers that false belief when he says, “That I may supply what is lacking in your faith.” Paul knew that no one has perfect faith. It needs to continually be nurtured and refreshed. He knew how Satan attacks faith. Satan looks for the holes in our faith in Christ. He attacks our thought, our words and our deeds. He tempts us to sin and to sin in such a way that we reject or refuse to receive God grace and forgiveness through Jesus Christ.

This is why Paul wanted to see the Christians in Thessalonica. He wanted to preach and teach the Word of God that their faith may be strengthen and held firmly in their hearts. He wanted them to be found faithful on the day Christ returns. He wanted them to have their sins washed away through the hearing of God's Word. He wanted them steadfast in faith when Christ

returns with all the saints in heaven.

This is why the Church on earth continues to go and preach the Word of God to all the nations. The Church on earth, that is, you, I, and all the believers in Christ, wants to spread, teach and proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ. We, too, want all people to come to the knowledge of Jesus Christ and be saved.

Conclusion:

As a part of the Church on earth, we are delighted to hear how Christians have remained faithful to Christ Jesus. We delight in hearing how others in the Church have held to the one true faith in spite of the obstacles and pressures they faced. It is our joy and delight to see those around us who hold to the truths of God's Word. We unceasingly give thanks to God, who has kept them and us in the one true faith till life everlasting.

We want what God wants, that is, we want all people to be blameless and holy at the coming of the Lord. God grant that His grace and forgiveness keep us blameless and holy in His sight. And may the joy of knowing we will see those saints who have kept the faith, fellow members of the Church, friends and family members, who have kept the faith in Christ till the end, fill our heart with exceeding joy and delight.

of wholeness. Guide scientists searching for cures for diseases that bring suffering to the world that their work might lead to healing for many. We pray,

C hear us, coming Lord.

P O Key of David, let Your joy, forgiveness, and peace flow freely in and among the families of this congregation. Empower parents and grandparents to love their children and children to love their parents. Watch over all who travel and comfort families who are separated by many miles. Guide families to be places where Your love is demonstrated to strangers as well as to friends. We pray,

C hear us, coming Lord.

P O Lord of might, help us during this Advent season both to look back to those days when our salvation was won in Your death and resurrection and to look forward to the day of Your return, when by Your power You will bring the dead to life and restore all creation. We pray,

C hear us, coming Lord.

P O Immanuel, You deliver Your people even from the grip of death. Comfort those who mourn and use us to express the hope that comes from trusting in You. Bring us to be with them on that great day to come, and until that day give us grace to endure life's difficulties, while also abiding in Your love. We pray,

C hear us, coming Lord.

P You, O Lord, know the thoughts of our hearts and hear those prayers that come to You in sighs too deep for words. All our prayer we entrust to You in the name of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.
