AS WE GATHER

SERMON "A Change in Our Perspective" 2 Corinthians 5:16–21

Introduction:

Jesus changes the way we think.

I. The way we look at others

Take for instance the way we think about others. Our opinions about others are basically formed on the way the other person thinks, speaks, believes and even what they look like. First impressions are based on what we see and hear. Some people put too much stock in first impressions. They make their decision about the other person and then begin to justify the way they think, speak and treat the other person.

Others are more willing to change their opinions as they get to know the other person. This can lead to a greater respect and even starting a friendship with them. It can work the other way. As they get to know the person better the less likely they are to continue to develop any deeper relationship with that person.

All this is based on the flesh of the person. I am not just talking about outward appearance. I am including what we call, "What's inside the person that counts." This is all a part of the flesh. People can be kind and generous. Or they can be cruel and selfish. In most cases, it depends on the day. If we caught them on a good day or a bad day, we judge them according to our flesh.

Now, Christ changes our way of thinking. While we identify sin in ourselves and in others, Christ leads us to think about the relationship we have and others have with the Father in heaven. While we and others at times can be real jerks to others, we stand forgiven in Christ. We begin to think of them not as a good Christian, but one who has been reconciled to Christ as we have been. Christ leads us to think of our self as not better than others but as one whom by His grace have been saved from the coming wrath of God. He leads us to see that our sin and their sin can only be removed by Christ. We both have been made children of God by Christ.

II. The way we look at the work of Christ

Therefore we begin to look at the work of Christ differently than the world. He is not a keeper of our wrongs. He is not merely an observer of human kind. He is not just a sideline coach encouraging us to love our neighbors as ourselves.

He is a reconciler. He brings two parties that were separated and beings them together. He makes it possible for the Father in heaven to accept the sinner. He does it by offering His life in the sinner's place.

Christ came in the flesh. He came to bear our sin. He became sin for us who knew no sin. He became guilty of sin though He was innocent of sin. He willingly bore the punishment of our sin and suffered death as to reconcile us to the Father. Because of Christ, the Father could welcome us into His arms as His dear children. And we can approach God as our dear Father.

Christ took on flesh and blood. But we no longer think of Him as a man, a good man who lived on earth. We think of Him as our Savior, our Lord, the Son of God, eternal, almighty, all-knowing, everywhere present with us throughout all our days.

This does not surprise us. Many of us from our childhood have always known and believed this. We know nothing different. Yet, it was Christ who changed our thinking to think thus of Him.

Conclusion:

Yet, when it comes to our fellow human beings, the Holy Spirit often times has to bring to our remembrance that this fellow Christian that we are dealing with is a redeemed Child of God. Christ has put as much work into them as He has into us. And through the eyes of Christ we are to think of them as Christ thinks of us.

In this way, we remember to confess our sins, to God seeking always to be reconciled to our Father in heaven. We have no desire to be alienated from Him. We want no thought, word or deed on our part to break the relationship we have with our Father through Christ Jesus. So, we ask Christ and thank Christ for being our reconciler with the Father.
