Do this more than once. Do it daily if you can. Include others especially children. Share it with others.

Later, when we begin to gather again at that building dedicated to the Lord and called Trinity Lutheran Church, you may and are encouraged to bring it along with your Bible.

Keep up the hand washing. Instead of singing a little children tune, sing "Jesus Loves Me" or "I Am Jesus' Little Lamb." You may wish to say the 23rd or 121st psalm. The words are included below.

As We Gather


It's said that darkness is nothing more than the absence of light. Darkness and blindness are words often used throughout Scripture to describe our sinfulness—the absence of the true Light. In our continued Lenten journey, we prepare our hearts for the dark afternoon of Good Friday at the cross. Yet even in that darkness, Jesus Christ brings the light of life. In our times of spiritual blindness and comfort in the darkness of this world, we gather again today to see His light through our vision of Spirit-given faith, that our eyes may look to Him who is the light of the world—the light no darkness can overcome.



Communion: (The Lord's Supper) is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His Words, repent of sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church/Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament are asked first to speak with Pastor.

To understand the teaching surrounding the Sacrament of the Altar turn to page 329 in the front of the hymnal and read "Christian Questions with Their Answers."

- P Beloved in the Lord, it is our intention to receive the Holy Supper of our Lord Jesus Christ, in which He strengthens our faith by giving us His body to eat and His blood to drink. Therefore, it is proper that we diligently examine ourselves, as St. Paul

urges us to do, for this holy Sacrament has been instituted for the special comfort of those who are troubled because of their sin and who humbly confess their sins, fear God's wrath, and hunger and thirst for righteousness.

But when we examine our hearts and consciences, we find nothing in us but sin and death, from which we are incapable of delivering ourselves. Therefore, our Lord Jesus Christ has had mercy on us. For our benefit He became man so that He might fulfill for us the whole will and law of God and, to deliver us, took upon Himself our sin and the punishment we deserve.

So that we may more confidently believe this and be strengthened in the faith and in holy living, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread, broke it, and gave it to His disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you." It is as if He said, "I became man, and all that I do and suffer is for your good. As a pledge of this, I give you My body to eat."

In the same way also He took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." Again, it is as if He said, "I have had mercy on you by taking into Myself all your iniquities. I give Myself into death, shedding My blood to obtain grace and forgiveness of sins, and to comfort and establish the new testament, which gives forgiveness and everlasting salvation. As a pledge of this, I give you My blood to drink."

Therefore, whoever eats this bread and drinks this cup, confidently believing this Word and promise of Christ, dwells in Christ and Christ in him and has eternal life.

We should also do this in remembrance of Him, showing His death—that He was delivered for our offenses and raised for our justification. Giving Him our most heartfelt thanks, we take up our cross and follow Him and, according to His commandment, love one another as He has loved us. For we are all one bread and one body, even as we are all partakers of this one bread and drink from the one cup. For just as the one cup is filled with wine of many grapes and one bread made from countless grains, so also we, being many, are one body in Christ. Because of Him, we love one another, not only in word, but in deed and in truth.

May the almighty and merciful God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, by His Holy Spirit, accomplish this in us.

Holy Gospel John 9:1–41(The Healing of the Man Blind From Birth)

P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the ninth chapter.



As he passed by, he saw a man blind from birth. [2] And his disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" [3] Jesus answered, "It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be displayed in him. [4] We must work the works of him who sent me while it is day; night is coming, when no one can work. [5] As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." [6] Having said these things, he spat on the ground and made mud with the saliva. Then he anointed the man's eyes with the mud [7] and said to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which means Sent). So he went and washed and came back seeing.

[8] The neighbors and those who had seen him before as a beggar were saying, "Is this not the man who used to sit and beg?" [9] Some said, "It is he." Others said, "No, but he is like him." He kept saying, "I am the man." [10] So they said to him, "Then how were your eyes opened?" [11] He answered, "The man called Jesus made mud and anointed my eyes and said to me, 'Go to Siloam and wash.' So I went and washed and received my sight." [12] They said to him, "Where is he?" He said, "I do not know."


[13] They brought to the Pharisees the man who had formerly been blind. [14] Now it was a Sabbath day when Jesus made the mud and opened his eyes. [15] So the Pharisees again asked him how he had received his sight. And he said to them, "He put mud on my eyes, and I washed, and I see." [16] Some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, for he does not keep the Sabbath." But others said, "How can a man who is a sinner do such signs?" And there was a division among them. [17] So they said again to the blind man, "What do you say about him, since he has opened your eyes?" He said, "He is a prophet."

[18] The Jews did not believe that he had been blind and had received his sight, until they called the parents of the man who had received his sight [19] and asked them, "Is this your son, who you say was born blind? How then does he now see?" [20] His parents answered, "We know that this is our son and that he was born blind. [21] But how he now sees we do not know, nor do we know who opened his eyes. Ask him; he is of age. He will speak for himself." [22] (His parents said these things because they feared the Jews, for the Jews had already agreed that if anyone should confess Jesus to be Christ, he was to be put out of the synagogue.) [23] Therefore his parents said, "He is of age; ask him."

[24] So for the second time they called the man who had been blind and said to him, "Give glory to God. We know that this man is a sinner." [25] He answered, "Whether he is a sinner I do not know. One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see." [26] They said to

him, "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?" [27] He answered them, "I have told you already, and you would not listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you also want to become his disciples?" [28] And they reviled him, saying, "You are his disciple, but we are disciples of Moses. [29] We know that God has spoken to Moses, but as for this man, we do not know where he comes from." [30] The man answered, "Why, this is an amazing thing! You do not know where he comes from, and yet he opened my eyes. [31] We know that God does not listen to sinners, but if anyone is a worshiper of God and does his will, God listens to him. [32] Never since the world began has it been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a man born blind. [33] If this man were not from God, he could do nothing." [34] They answered him, "You were born in utter sin, and would you teach us?" And they cast him out.

[35] Jesus heard that they had cast him out, and having found him he said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" [36] He answered, "And who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" [37] Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and it is he who is speaking to you." [38] He said, "Lord, I believe," and he worshiped him. [39] Jesus said, "For judgment I came into this world, that those who do not see may see, and those who see may become blind." [40] Some of the Pharisees near him heard these things, and said to him, "Are we also blind?" [41] Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would have no guilt; but now that you say, 'We see,' your guilt remains.





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<u>Sermon</u> "What Happened to Us?" Based on Ephesians 5:8–14 Rev. Rodney Blomquist, Pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church, Taylorville, Illinois

Introduction:

You and I have dealt with a deadly disease all our lives. It is called sin. Our parents infected us with it and we infected our children. It has brought death to all. No one can escape it. No isolation can slow its process and effects.

Earthly diseases are different. They can be controlled through vaccinations, sanitary practices, quarantines and isolation. We will never be able to rid the world of diseases, sickness and death. They are here because of the fall of man into sin. And will remain till the day Christ returns.

We do not want earthly diseases to define us. We do not call ourselves, "Coronavirusinners," "Cancerinners," or "Common Coldinners." But we do call ourselves "Sinners."

Yet, we do not want to be identified as to what we were. We cling to what we are in Christ. We were darkness. Now we are Children of light. So, what happened to us? That is to say what change has taken place in our lives to transform us from darkness to light?

I. We were darkness

It is important to know what we were before being in Christ. We were lost and condemned creatures, enemies of God and ruled by our sinful natures. We had no spiritual insight to the One and Only true God. We were incapable of living a perfect life. And we were conceived and born in sin.

It was a dark time with an even darker future. It was a helpless time because we could do no good or any good works that would appease the wrath of God. We were doomed. We were spiritually dead. Much like being helpless toward in becoming sick, we were helpless against sin and all its deadly consequences.

This was the darkness we were in without Christ. It was and is the same darkness that the unbelieving world still lives in. Fear can over take them. Selfishness can become the rule of the day. Personal strength and character can only last till something bigger them themselves and the world over powers them. Ultimately the disaster called the fall of man into sin takes their lives and they perish.

This is not who we are in Christ. Yet, we still sin as if we are darkness. We still possess a fallen nature. The world cannot always distinguish a child of light from a good and decent person. They can clearly see that we are as sinful as they are. We can see this for ourselves. So, why then do we not consider ourselves darkness but children of light? What happened to us?

II. Now in Christ we are children of light

The quick and simplest answer is the person of Jesus the Christ. He is the Light of the world. This Light has shine on us. It has revealed our sin and our darkness. This Light should have destroyed us like the wicked witch of the north from the novel, "The Wizard of Oz," was destroy by water or as a fable vampire from horror fiction is destroyed by the sunlight.

Yet, He did not destroy us. This Light also revealed to us that He took upon flesh and blood to be our Savior. He took our sins and the punishment for them to the cross. There He paid for them by suffering the full and complete wrath of God, the punishment of our sin. He died as the sacrifice for the sin of the world.

Then He rose again so that He, the Light, can shine on us His grace and the forgiveness the Father wants to give and has given to us. Yes, this Light has shined on us through His Word. He has shown to us our salvation. He revealed that He has given us His Holy Spirit through Baptism and the hearing of the Word of God. He has revealed to us the truth of His Word. He has revealed to us that through the bread and wine He gives us His body and blood so that we may know for certain that our sins are forgiven and that we are children of light.

So, now we are to go and live as children light. We are to go and serve God and our neighbor in what is good, right and true. We are a light to the world showing forth the fruit of faith, avoiding the things of darkness and reveal the darkness of the world.

At this time of the COVID-19 outbreak, we are to try to discern what is God-pleasing. This is not always clear. We want to be informed yet not spread false information which causes fear and anxiety. We want to do what is best for our families while not hording thus hurting our neighbor by robbing him of his needs. We follow and obey our God-appointed leaders while not taking advantage of the situation to advance ones political career or destroying it by bearing false witness against our neighbor. We are to offer help while avoiding others when sick. And the list goes on.

It is hard and difficult to sort through the clamor. It is difficult to know what to do at any given moment.

So, we pray as children of light knowing God is in control. He will deliver us. For, some He will keep the virus away. For others, they will endure being infected and thus wait on the Lord for recovery. And yes, God will through this pan epidemic deliver others to their eternal reward in heaven.

We stay in the Word as children of light knowing God's grace. We repent of any sin His light has revealed within us. We ask Him for strength to live as children of light so others may see Jesus as their Lord and Savior. We pray that He continues to wake us from our sleep and increase in us to take to heart, even more seriously, the work and salvation Christ has wrought for us.

Conclusion:

There is nothing new here on earth that Christ has not seen and dealt with since the fall of man into sin. This truth Christ has shined upon us. God the Holy Spirit will continue to call us to open our eyes from sleep and see all things in the light Christ provides.


A Let us pray.
