

Living among the Bible's Trees: Jesse's Tree


Lent Midweek 4 March 18, 2020

Opening Sentences

Psalm 1:1-3; 96:12-13; Isaiah 61:1, 3

- P Blessed is the man whose delight is in the law of the Lord.
- C He is like a tree planted by streams of water.
- P The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the poor; . . .
- C that they may be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord.
- P Then shall all the trees of the forest sing for joy before the Lord,
- C for He comes, for He comes to judge the earth.

Confession and Absolution

Psalm 80:19; Isaiah 61:1, 3

- P Let us confess our sins to God our heavenly Father.
- C Heavenly Father, we confess that we are bound to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have "eaten forbidden fruit" in our thoughts, words, and deeds. We have not produced spiritual fruit in keeping with the new life You have won for us. For the sake of Jesus' sacrifice on the tree of the cross, grant us Your forgiveness. Restore us, O Lord God of hosts! Let Your face shine, that we may be saved! Amen.
- P After His triumph over Satan's temptations in the wilderness, Jesus went to the synagogue in Nazareth and announced that the prophecy of Isaiah was being fulfilled in Him. The prophet had written, "The Spirit of the Lord God is upon Me,

because the Lord has anointed Me . . . to grant to those who mourn in Zion . . . a beautiful headdress instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the garment of praise instead of a faint spirit; that they may be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, that He may be glorified."

As a called and ordained servant of Christ I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the T Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Psalm

Psalm 80:8–19; antiphon: v. 19

- P Restore us, O Lord God of hosts! Let Your face shine, that we may be saved!
 - You brought a vine out of Egypt;
- C You drove out the nations and planted it.
- P You cleared the ground for it;
- C it took deep root and filled the land.
- P The mountains were covered with its shade,
- C the mighty cedars with its branches.
- P It sent out its branches to the sea
- C and its shoots to the River.
- P Why then have You broken down its walls,
- C so that all who pass along the way pluck its fruit?
- P The boar from the forest ravages it,
- C and all that move in the field feed on it.
- P Turn again, O God of hosts!
- C Look down from heaven, and see; have regard for this vine,
- P the stock that Your right hand planted,
- C and for the son whom You made strong for Yourself.
- P They have burned it with fire; they have cut it down;
- C may they perish at the rebuke of Your face!

First Reading

Isaiah 6:1–13

¹In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. ²Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. ³And one called to another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!"

⁴And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke. ⁵And I said: "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"

⁶Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a burning coal that he had taken with tongs from the altar. ⁷And he touched my mouth and said: "Behold, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for."

⁸And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here am I! Send me." ⁹And he said, "Go, and say to this people:

"Keep on hearing, but do not understand; keep on seeing, but do not perceive."

¹⁰Make the heart of this people dull, and their ears heavy, and blind their eyes; lest they see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their hearts, and turn and be healed."

¹¹Then I said, "How long, O Lord?" And he said:

"Until cities lie waste without inhabitant,

and houses without people,
and the land is a desolate waste,

12 and the LORD removes people far away,
and the forsaken places are many in the midst of the land.

13 And though a tenth remain in it,
it will be burned again,
like a terebinth or an oak,
whose stump remains
when it is felled."

The holy seed is its stump.

Isaiah 10:33—11:16

³³Behold, the Lord GOD of hosts will lop the boughs with terrifying power; the great in height will be hewn down, and the lofty will be brought low.
³⁴He will cut down the thickets of the forest with an axe, and Lebanon will fall by the Majestic One.

¹There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit. ²And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD. ³And his delight shall be in the fear of the LORD. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide disputes by what his ears hear, ⁴but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; and he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth. and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. ⁵Righteousness shall be the belt of his waist, and faithfulness the belt of his loins. ⁶The wolf shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the young goat, and the calf and the lion and the fattened calf together; and a little child shall lead them. ⁷The cow and the bear shall graze; their young shall lie down together;

and the lion shall eat straw like the ox.

⁸The nursing child shall play over the hole of the cobra, and the weaned child shall put his hand on the adder's den.

⁹They shall not hurt or destroy

in all my holy mountain;

for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the LORD as the waters cover the sea.

¹⁰In that day the root of Jesse, who shall stand as a signal for the peoples—of him shall the nations inquire, and his resting place shall be glorious.

¹¹In that day the Lord will extend his hand yet a second time to recover the remnant that remains of his people, from Assyria, from Egypt, from Pathros, from Cush, from Elam, from Shinar, from Hamath, and from the coastlands of the sea.

¹²He will raise a signal for the nations and will assemble the banished of Israel, and gather the dispersed of Judah from the four corners of the earth.
¹³The jealousy of Ephraim shall depart, and those who harass Judah shall be cut off; Ephraim shall not be jealous of Judah, and Judah shall not harass Ephraim.

¹⁴But they shall swoop down on the shoulder of the Philistines in the west, and together they shall plunder the people of the east.

They shall put out their hand against Edom and Moab,

and the Ammonites shall obey them.

¹⁵And the LORD will utterly destroy the tongue of the Sea of Egypt,

and will wave his hand over the River

with his scorching breath,

and strike it into seven channels,

and he will lead people across in sandals.

¹⁶And there will be a highway from Assyria for the remnant that remains of his people,

as there was for Israel

when they came up from the land of Egypt.





P Let us pray for the Church here and around the world, and for people everywhere in their various needs.


For everyone weighed down by their bondage to sin and an inability to stop sinning by thought, word, and deed, let us pray to the Lord.

Collect for Peace


- P Let us pray.
