SECOND SUNDAY IN ADVENT

Prepare December 4 & 5, 2021

AS WE GATHER

Preparing for Christmas, we buy presents, attend social gatherings, decorate, make plans to gather with family, and some will brace for the pain of grief that can be so difficult this time of year. In the middle of all our preparing, today the voice of John the Baptist rings out, "Prepare the way of the Lord." Undergirding all the preparing we are doing is preparing for the Lord. John calls us to "bear fruits in keeping with repentance." In worship, we do just that. We repent. We turn again to God, seeking His mercy, receiving His



forgiveness, partaking of His grace. This leads to bearing the fruit of the Spirit. John highlights the fruit of generosity and contentment. What fruit is God calling you to bear as you prepare for Christmas?

He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. ¹⁷His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

¹⁸So with many other exhortations he preached good news to the people. ¹⁹But Herod the tetrarch, who had been reproved by him for Herodias, his brother's wife, and for all the evil things that Herod had done, ²⁰added this to them all, that he locked up John in prison.

SERMON "A Thank You Letter" Philippians 1:2–11

Introduction:

Last week we read a part of a letter Paul wrote to the Christians in Thessolanica expressing his joy for their faithfulness during a difficult time. Today, we have another letter of Paul's expressing his gratitude for the help he received from the Christians in Philippi.

I. He thank God for the Christians in Philippi.

Again, he gives thanks to God for these Christians. They had offered assistance to Paul while he was imprisoned in Rome. They were concern about Paul and the work he was doing. They wanted the Gospel of Jesus Christ to be taught to others as it was taught to them.

Paul expresses this by describing them as being in partnership with him. He saw how important the Word of God was to them. He expresses this by stating with confidence that the Lord who had created their faith will see to it that it remained until completion, that is, until the day Christ returned.

This is the desire of all good and faithful pastors. We want everyone whom God has created faith in their hearts to remain faithful in this one true faith till life everlasting. It is why we continue to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

II. He petitioned God on their behalf.

Interestingly, Paul shows his gratitude by petitioning God that the Christians in Philippi would increase in love. It was in love that they offered help to Paul and worked along side him in spreading the Gospel.

He asked God to increase their love with discernment and knowledge. Often times, we do not always discern what is love, or a loving act. Yet, with the knowledge Christ gives us through His Word, we can discern what is love. Our words, our thoughts and our actions begin to formed around the Word of God. Often times, this is in deep contrast to the world.

Take for instance, the issue of abortion. The Supreme Court is now considering a case that could change the course of history. People claim that it is a loving thought, a caring word and a helpful action to fight for the "right" of a woman to have control over their own bodies. We may even be tempted to think that legal abortions can be a choice for the woman. We think we are showing love.

The Word of God moves us to understand this is not a loving thought, a caring word or a helpful solution. Rather, the protection of the unborn is a the loving thought, the caring word and the helpful solution. The Scriptures gives us discernment and knowledge in this matter. It gives us the knowledge that this is a child. It moves us to think of them in love. It moves us to say a caring word to the mother. It moves us to offer a helpful hand in the support of the child and all who are involved with the birth of this child.

There are many more illustrations in life that could be used. For the Philippians, their work and support of the preaching of the Gospel is driven by the Word, that Word that brought them the forgiveness of sin and life everlasting. It was that Gospel through which the Holy Spirit works

to make us look blameless in the sight of God. It was that faith in Christ created by the Holy Spirit through the Word which will make us look blameless in the sight of God when Christ returns.

Conclusion:

Paul was grateful for the love the Philippians showed. He remembered them in His prayers. This is how we too can show are gratitude for all the saints who work together to peach the Gospel of Jesus Christ throughout the world. We can continue to support them in their work and continue to give thanks for their partnership in the spreading of the Gospel.
