Pass It On

In preparation for Proper 11 – July 19, 2020

Take a look at the state of things in our country and in our world. We see a world infected with plague, with division, with violence, with injustice. It may seem as if one thing that has been completely wiped out is hope. We see a world filled with suffering.

The Bible doesn't dance around the difficult question of suffering. It says that sin's deep roots within mankind reach out to entangle the entire creation. Sin causes us to groan, eagerly anticipating relief from all this darkness.

Those who believe in Jesus do not escape suffering. However, Christians see suffering as following where Jesus once walked, enduring with patience while holding firm to their hope of eternal salvation in the Lord Jesus Christ.

Jesus calls Christians, as those who have been saved and who have been given the “firstfruits of the Spirit” (Romans 8:23), to spread their fruits throughout the world. The greatest of those fruits are faith, hope, and love (1 Corinthians 13:13).

The Bible adds that the Holy Spirit given to Christians by Jesus intercedes on their behalf. When they experience burdens on their shoulders and hearts, the Spirit prays with “groanings too deep for words” (Romans 8:26).

All in all: the world may suggest that suffering reigns supreme, yet the Bible presents a different message in where hope comes out on top. It says that “the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us” (Romans 8:18).

In Jesus, Christians are nourished and sustained to endure this world of suffering and to spread the faith they have, the love they have been given, and the everlasting hope that they eagerly anticipate. We invite you to hear more about the hope found in Jesus this Sunday at our church service.

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SERMON: *“Know the World In Which We Live”*

Romans 8:18–27

Introduction:

One of the characteristics of Christianity is that we do not try to escape from this world. Christianity is not another transcendental meditation type of religion. It is not like Buddhism, Hinduism and other branches of these religions. Many of these religions’ goals are to escape from this world. It is to be free of the world even now and in the future. It is a technique in which one escapes this world by emptying the mind.

Christ never did this. When He stepped away from the hassle and bustle of this world, He went to talk, pray to His Father in heaven. He took His Sabbath rest by going to the Father. And so are we to do the same in handling this world in which we live.

I. We look to Christ

This world is a hard place to live. And we know why. It was because of the sin of Adam and Eve. When they fell into sin, they dragged this old world in with them. The curse of sin was death. This brought pandemics, sickness, epidemics, injuries, sniffles, coughing, hatred, racism, wars, injustices, and so on and so on. Anything and everything which remind us we are returning to dust.

The ground was cursed on account of Adam’s sin. This makes life hard and difficult. This is what wears us down mentally, emotionally and physically. Women understand why child bearing is so hard on the body, the mind and the emotions. It was the sin of our first mother who brought this upon us.

The world suffers because of the sin of man. It may be why the world sees nature as being innocent. Some activists may go overboard in protecting it, making nature more of a god than a creation which reflects a good and gracious God.

This world suffers because of man and it groans. It looks forward to the revelation of the Children of God. It looks forward to the day Christ will return and when all evil will be cast away.

And this is what God calls us to do. We are look at our suffering in comparison to this day when Christ returns. We are to meditate on the glories that await us in the presence of Christ.

We are to concentrate on what Christ has prepared for us. We are to look at what He has done to bring the peace of God to us. Gifts such as the forgiveness of sin; deliverance from sin, death and the power of the devil; the resurrection from the dead; the gift of eternal life; and a new body that will not suffer sickness nor death nor sin. We are to ponder the glories that far outweigh the suffering we face on earth.

This is not a method to escape the world. It is our daily Sabbath rest in the Lord. We are not to empty our minds so that Satan can come and lead us away from Christ. We are to ponder these things and go to Him in prayer, calling on Him in the day of trouble, praising Him for His deliverance.

II. We look to the Holy Spirit

And this is not easy. It is easier to empty our minds and not think about what is happening in this world and in our lives. It is easier to try to escape than it is to deal with life. And there are times when this world crashes down on us and the curse of sin overwhelms us. We are not able to and cannot find the words or the strength to begin to pray.

God reassures us that the Holy Spirit is already at work praying for and with us. He speaks to the Father on our behalf. His prayers go deeper into the heart of God than we could ever imagine. He knows the mind of the Father. He knows what we are facing and how hard it is to live in this old world. He knows our minds more than we could ever hope to know. He speaks to the Father in groans deeper than any words could express.

He makes our prayers the greatest expression of faith in Christ and the Father when we say, "God, help me."

Knowing this about the Holy Spirit leads us to understand that we are not escaping this world when we pray. It is just the opposite. We are dealing with the world. We are dealing with God. We are taking our Sabbath rest and are placing all things in the hands of our good and gracious God.

And God blesses us. He gives us family, friends, neighbors and even strangers who support and help us. He gives us work and tasks to distract our minds from the agony of this world. He gives us other whom we can serve and in doing so serve God.

Conclusion:

This old world is a hard place in which to live. Yet, knowing the world and why it is a hard place moves us to seek the aid and help of God our heavenly Father, our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and the Comforter, the Holy Spirit.

Schools and work places encourage a person to empty their mind. They say, "Put all your troubles away. Go to your happy place." God says, "Call upon me and I will give you rest." Teach your children to ponder the glories that await them and to consider these glories greater

than any suffering here on earth. In this way, their minds are set on God where the true rest is found.

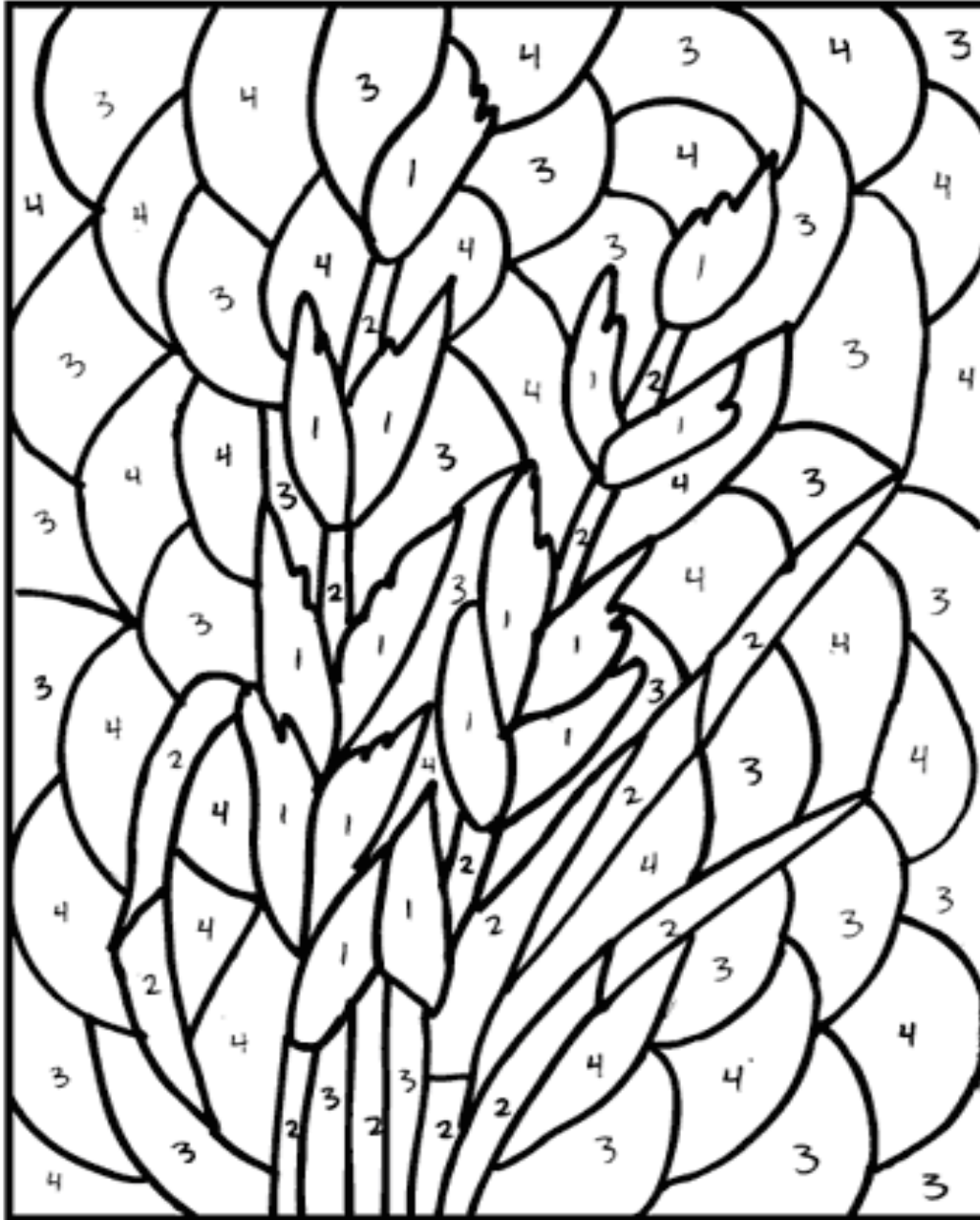
