### **First Reading Acts 10:34–48**

<sup>34</sup>Peter opened his mouth and said: “Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, <sup>35</sup>but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. <sup>36</sup>As for the word that he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ (he is Lord of all), <sup>37</sup>you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: <sup>38</sup>how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. <sup>39</sup>And we are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. **Sermon** *“Do You Love Everyone?” John 15:9–17*

Introduction:

Do you love everyone all the time? If anyone says yes to this question they are a liar or they do not understand what love means. Love means being ready and quick to lay down one life for another person. It means sacrificing oneself for the needs of others. It means that we will do this for anyone at any time in any place. It means that there is no hatred or resentment in our hearts for anyone at any time. It means having holy and pure thoughts about everyone all the time.

So, what moves us to love others when we are so poor at doing it?

### I. It is God’s command

First of all it is God’s command. “Love your neighbor as yourself.” But what is the reason behind God wanting us to love one another. Well, it shows that He abides in us and we abide in Him. What He desires we in faith desire to do the same. It is the working of the Holy Spirit in our hearts to love others as God has loved us.

Now, the world says the same thing. The world says we should love one another so that the world will be a better place. And this is true. It would be a safer and better place to live. But the world cannot help us love others. This is to say, the world cannot enter into our hearts, change our hearts or empower us to love others. All the world can offer is a suggestion, an argument for loving each other.

Yet, the world distorts love. The world uses the word, “love,” to cover up sinful lusts and desires. How do we know this? We know it from the commandments God has given us.

He has described what love is. Luther pickup on this when he wrote these words at the beginning of each commandment’s meaning, “We should fear and love God so that...”

It is in the commandments that love is described and defined. It is how we can examine ourselves to know what is a loving thought, word or deed. And what is not a loving word, thought or deed but is actually sin trying to disguise itself as love.

And today, now in our own society and globally, we need to study and learn these commandments so that we can fend off temptation and the deception of the world, our own sinful flesh and Satan. We need to look into the mirror of the Law and see our own sin, confess it to God and once again be forgiven of our lack of love, our lack of ability to love in a pure and holy manner and to be strengthened to go forth and love our neighbor as ourselves. We need His forgiveness so that we can go forth and be seen as disciples of Jesus Christ.

## II. Christ loves us

And yet there is a greater reason why we are to love one another. It is because Christ loves us. And this is more than “paying it forward.” It is more than gratitude. It is more than a moral obligation.

Christ’s love for us dwells within us. When He entered our hearts through the Word and also through the water, Baptism, His love for us and others was brought into our hearts.

We are not just here to emulate His love. It is His love that works through us to others. It is His motivation to love us that motivates us to love others. It is His love that overcomes our hatred, our prejudices and our resentments toward others. It is His love that makes our weak attempts to love other acceptable in the sight of God. It is His love for, in and with us that makes us look like loving and caring people to God and to the world.

It is His love for the world that works in our hearts to love our neighbor as ourselves. We take no credit, no glory or merit in doing this. We know that it is Christ who laid down His life for us because He loved us and the Father. We know that it is by the grace of God through Christ that our hearts are changed. We know that it is by the help of God that we love one another.

### Conclusion:

There are people, family members, neighbors, co-workers and our enemies that are hard and impossible to love. We need to understand this. We need to acknowledge it. Because when we do and when the desire to do as God commands comes into our hearts we turn to Christ for Him to work through us what is impossible for us to raise up in our own hearts. And that is, love them as ourselves.

And remember this God’s love does makes us strong and smart. He makes us strong enough to walk away from a dangerous and abusive relationship, be it in marriage, family, school, work or even a church congregation. God desires that we too are loved by others as He has loved us and others.

So, we call on Christ to continue to work in our hearts the love He has for His Father and for all people, our neighbors. In this way, we abide in Him and He in us. And we are seen as His disciples.
