Pass It On

In preparation for Proper 14 – August 9, 2020

Alex was sitting by the lake, gazing out at the sun setting over the water, with a slight breeze dancing across his skin. Although the world was beyond his comprehension, he still loved treasuring its beauty each day.

In a Scripture reading for this week, God talked about this beautiful world that He created. He spoke to a man named Job about a creation that lies beyond man's comprehension.

God began by asking Job: "Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding" (Job 38:4). The language used here indicates creation as God's personal handiwork, crafted with care – something into which He poured His energy.

Not only was this creation made with the utmost care; it also displays the majesty and power of God. A bit later, the LORD said to Job: "Have you commanded the morning since your days began, and caused the dawn to know its place?" (Job 38:12).

The world around us shows both the majesty and care of God. Furthermore, the glorious truth is that He so carefully and majestically created everything around us for the benefit of His most intimate and beautiful creation: you and me.

(that is, to bring Christ down) ⁷or "'Who will descend into the abyss?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). ⁸But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); ⁹because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. ¹¹For the Scripture says, "Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame." ¹²For there is no distinction

Sermon "Hearing"

Romans 10:5-17

Introduction:

Sound waves activate the hearing sense. The ability to hear does not activate sound waves. So, when a tree falls in the forest, it sends out a wave, or vibration. It does not become sound until it reaches the ear activating the sense of hearing.

When it comes to saving faith in our hearts, it is the Holy Spirit who actives our faith in Christ Jesus. He does so through the Word.

I. It is near us

This takes place in our hearts. God is not a god who is distant from us. He doesn't just send us a letter or two to read and then waits for our response. He is not an impersonal God who does a mass mailing.

He takes deep interest in each and every one of us. He draws close to us. And it is not just to embrace His arms around us. He goes deeper. He actually dwells in us.

His Word is like seed. It penetrates the hearts and takes up roots there.

This Word that we are speaking of is Jesus Christ. He dwells in us. We did not go up to heaven to seek Him. We did not raise Him up from the dead to be our Savior. He came to us. He dwelt among us. The Word became flesh. He lived the perfect life. He suffered and died. He rose again. He ascended into heaven. He came to us to do for us what we could do for ourselves. He came to save us and give us life.

And yet, He does not stand outside of us saying, "Grab hold of me and I will save you." No, He grabs hold of us. More than that, He has entered into our hearts to dwell there with us till the end of time. So close is He to us that nothing can separate us from Him. He would have to be wrenched out of our hearts. And again, nothing is able to stop Him from reaching into our hearts and taking up residency.

II. Faith comes by it

God wants us to be at peace about our salvation. He wants us to live with the assurance that He has forgiven us our sins and has united us to Him forever. And so, He declares to us that the faith we have in Him came through the hearing of His Word and not by any thought, word or deed on our part.

He has placed Himself within us so that we would believe and thus be justified, speak and be saved. The source of both the believing and the speaking is Christ and the Holy Spirit presence in our hearts. It is not produced by us for we could not produce it. It is not requested by us because we would never humble ourselves to request it. And it is not done apart from the Word

less we be deceived by false doctrines and man-made religions.

God has declared that He works through the Word to create faith in the hearts of people. He uses this mean so that we do not rely on our own wisdom and understanding. We are not able to comprehend a God so gracious and loving that He would sacrifice His own Son for the sin of the world. We would have continued to look only to ourselves for the hope of salvation. We would have been left in despair never knowing for sure if we could ever stand before God righteous in His sight.

Because God uses this means of grace, His Word, to reach our hearts, He sends out people with the Word to share with others. His great commission begins with "Go." This could actually be translated, "As you are going." This means that where ever one of God's disciples goes or travels the Word of God goes with them. It means as we go to work, to school, to the store or wherever, God's Word goes with us. It is not something we can leave at home. It is not something that remains at church. Because Christ dwells in our hearts, the Word is there. The message of salvation is close at hand and ready to be shared. Anyone around us is within hearing distance of God's grace working in their heart.

This is why parents continue to speak to their children about Jesus. In doing so, Christ goes to work in the child's heart to keep them in the one true faith. It is why we have conversation about Christ's grace and mercy with others. The Holy Spirit goes to work on their hearts. It is why we continue to gather, even in small groups rather than large one in this day of the pandemic. It is so that the Holy Spirit works in our hearts to keep us in the one true faith till life everlasting.

Conclusion:

One of the greatest dangers to our salvation is the lie of Satan who says, "You know this stuff. You don't need to listen to it any longer." The sinful flesh of the young and old alike attempts to grab hold of this lie, so that, we separate ourselves from the hearing of God's Word.

But God continues to seek us out. He continues to surround us with those who speak His Word so that we do not buy into this lie but rather rejoice that the Word remains in us convincing us to continue to hear God's Word for the strengthening of faith and the assurance of our salvation.
