As We Gather

A familiar sight along highways and roadways in summer is the posting of work-zone signs as repairs are made to streets and bridges during the season of good weather. These signs bring a special level of care and concentration for drivers. For Christian people, the Church is the "work zone" of the Holy Spirit. In his hymn paraphrasing the Apostles' Creed, Martin Luther writes of the Holy Spirit at work: "Who the Church, His own creation, Keeps in unity of spirit. Here forgiveness and salvation Daily come through Jesus' merit" (*LSB* 954:3). As we are called and gathered, we are assured that we are in the most vital of work zones—the one to which we can give our greatest care and concentration.

Sermon "*The Gift of the Helper*" *John 15:26–27; 16:4b–15*

Introduction:

People give of themselves. They give of their time, their talents and their treasures. Some have even given their lives such as military and law enforcement. Our God has given Himself to us. Christ has given Himself to us. He has given us His holy life so that we may be holy in the sight of the Father. He has given us His life so that by His blood we may be washed clean of our sin. He has given Himself life again so that we may have life everlasting in His presence.

God has given Himself to us. He has given us His Holy Spirit.

I. He comes from the Father

The Holy Spirit does not act on His own accord, just like the Son didn't act on His own accord. They acted as the Father commanded and willed.

This doesn't make them subordinate or any lesser a god. All three are Divine. They are God. And the Holy Spirit is fully God.

Yet, in cooperation with the Father and the Son, the Holy Spirit proceeds from them to come to us. He is sent by the Father. This is an act of His Fatherly love for us. Not only does the Father so love the world that He sent His only begotten Son that whosoever believes in Him shall not perish but have everlasting life, He also sent the Holy Spirit who produces and maintains this gift of faith within our hearts. It is always to be seen as a gracious and loving act on the part of the Father when the Holy Spirit enters into the hearts of people.

It was an act of love on the part of the Father when at our Baptism or if you come to faith later in life He placed the Holy Spirit in our hearts. It is always to be seen as an act of His love and desire to have us as His own when the Holy Spirit comes into our hearts.

And when Christ announced that He was going to depart so that He could send the Helper, the Holy Spirit, it is to be viewed as a loving and caring act on His part. He gave Himself for our salvation. He gives us His Holy Spirit that we may believe and be saved.

II. He is a witness

It was mentioned last week that Christ opened the minds of the disciples to understand the

Scriptures. I mentioned what a great gift that was for us. I mentioned how the Holy Spirit becomes our teacher. Today, we hear how He is a witness and a guide to the truth.

Again it is important to understand that the Holy Spirit doesn't do this of His own accord. He is sent by the Father to guide us in all truth. Even though the Holy Spirit is God, He works with the Father on our behalf. He knows the Father's will and prays on our behalf that His will be done among us.

The Holy Spirit does not go and proclaim the truth on His own accord though He knows it well. He stills delivers what that Father wants His children to know. The Holy Spirit is not like a false prophet which spews their own thoughts as if they were God's thoughts. The Holy Spirit brings to us what the Father wants us to know and what we need to know in order to be saved.

The Holy Spirit is sent by the Father as a witness to what the Father and the Son has done to bring us our salvation. The Holy Spirit works in our hearts as one who does know the Father and has seen what the Son has done for us.

The Holy Spirit does the work which He is given by the Father to do. And this is a great comfort to us. The Holy Spirit is to convict the unbeliever of their sin. It frustrates us when we announce the word of God and the world turns a deaf ear to us. Yet, when a person confesses their sin, this is the work of the Holy Spirit working through the Law. We have the joy of announcing the grace of God through Christ Jesus. Yet, when that person grabs hold of the forgiveness of sin and is made righteous in the sight of God, the Holy Spirit is given the glory for bringing them to faith. And when a person is judge to be a believer or not, this is the Holy Spirit's work of reporting back to the Father who is a believer and who still rejects the grace of God.

Conclusion:

Yes, it is important for us to cling to the truth that the Holy Spirit does not work on His accord but under and with the authority of the Father. In this way, we know there is no arguing or disagreement on the part of the Trinity over how we are saved. It is in full harmony and agreement that no other name can one be saved other than that of the name of Jesus. We have the peace of a singular voice, the voice of the Father, the voice of Christ and the voice of the Holy Spirit saying to us. Your sins are forgiven. You have been saved by the grace of God.
