AS WE GATHER

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SERMON "An Arranged Union" Ephesians 3:1-12

Introduction:

Back in the good old days, congregations had mission festivals. It was a standard practice. We have had similar events such a dinner with a mission speaker. Maybe after this pandemic is over, there will be greater and freer movement of missionaries coming home for a respite.

I remember one particular mission event. After the service, the congregation gathered for a meal in the fellowship hall. I was privileged to get to sit by the pastor from Nigeria. Across from us sat a young coupled engaged to be married.

The Pastor asked the couple if they were getting married. The couple graciously acknowledged they were. He then asked them why. "Why you getting married?"

The couple blushing answered, "Because we love each other."

The Pastor replied smiling, "Not a good reason. Love is not a good reason to get married. My father picked out a wife for me. We learned to love each other. That is a good way to get married."

This is a good way to think and understand the relationship between a pastor and the congregation. God has arranged a union between the congregation and the man He puts into office. And we approach a time when a new man will be in the office of the pastor here at Trinity, it is good to be reminded of the roles each plays in this union.

I. First the Apostles and Evangelist and preached by the Pastor

The role of the pastor is similar yet not the same of that of the Apostle Paul. While both are to be stewards of the mystery of God as reveal by God, Paul was inspired by the Holy Spirit to bring this Word to the Gentile. The pastor is not inspired by the Holy Spirit to bring the Word of God. He is to take the inspired word of God as revealed through Scriptures and proclaim, preach and teach it to the people.

Neither Paul nor the pastor has volunteered for this work. They are called, Paul by Christ Himself and the pastor by Christ through the Church. It is true that a man who desires to be a pastor desires a good thing. The Apostle Paul writes about the duties of the pastor in his letters to Timothy and Titus. But the work of the Pastor is to bring the revealed Word to the people. They are to teach and preach the Law and Gospel in a distinct manner so that the Holy Spirit will work in the hearts of people creating, sustaining and strengthening the faith in Christ.

They are to preach this to all people fulfilling the mystery that salvation is to be preached to Jew and Gentile alike.

II. The Church

The congregation is to think and hold this as the most important task their pastor is to have in the midst. They are to look to him for guidance in the Word, the announcement of forgiveness from God the Father through Christ Jesus and to be Christ's representative in their midst as they worship; as they serve the Father and one another; and when at times of difficulties, sickness and times of grieving stand as a reminder that Christ is present.

The Church is to remember that God uses the Church to proclaim His Word and the good news of salvation to the world. They are to remember that in proclaiming this the angels in heaven hear this message and rejoice and the demons shutter in fear. This is the most pleasing sound in heaven along with the repentance of a sinner and the praise of the saints.

It is a union arranged by Christ. The pastor is not a hireling. He is not just filling a position in the Church. There is union between the pastor and the congregation. It is a union much like a marriage and that of being the head of the family.

The pastor and the congregation learn to love and serve each other. There is no dating period prior to the union. The time a pastor and congregation is together is when they get to know each. They learn how to love and forgive each other. They learn the others' character, their short comings and their benefit to the Church and to each other.

The Pastor as the head of the congregation goes through much the same things that the head of the family goes through. There is the joy of birth of a person when they first believe and are baptized. There is the sting when one of the family members is called to their heavenly home. There is the grief when one of the family members rejects the truth and the faith to go their own way. There is the struggle when one falls into the ways of the world much like that of seeing a child fall into an addiction and abandons the family. There is the joy of the prodigal son returning. There is the hatred of seeing siblings fighting and the pride when they work together for the good of the family. There is the sadness when one plans a family get together as in worship and being at the table of the Lord and the family members have other things to do. There is the prayers for those who are separate such those in the military hoping God will keep them safe and in faith till they are able to be reunited with the family. There is the balancing of the "honey-do" list and the time together in doing the task given by God.

Conclusion:

The relationship between a pastor and his congregation is like that of an arranged marriage/union. He is to be the representative of Christ to the Church and the Church is to obey him as one who has to give an accounting to the souls he is given charge over.

Keep this in mind as we continue to go through the process of calling and preparing to receive a new man in this office of the pastor. And may God grant us strength to wait on Him to provide the one He has prepared to be the pastor here.
