Easter

"He is not here!" Such good news, but such an odd choice of words. We hear these words from the angel in the Bible reading from Mark this Sunday. Mark describes the angel as a young man. But we know from other places in the Bible that this is an angel, there to deliver this good news.

Some of the women who had been following Jesus are there at the tomb, early on Easter morning, to care for Jesus' body. There wasn't time on Friday when the soldiers took Him down from the cross, and His followers laid Him in a tomb. The women love Jesus. They are coming to care for Him in the best way they know how.

But "He is not here," they hear. Why? "He has risen" from the dead! Just as Jesus promised, the grave cannot hold Him. Death is defeated. Sin is paid for. The Fall into Sin of the first parents, Adam and Eve, no more has hold over the fate of mankind. Instead, in Christ, man shall not die but shall live and call upon the name of the Lord.

The women trembled with astonishment and fear as they ran away. Their hearts and minds couldn't quite grasp this wonderful news. Though they will, soon.

We are tempted to think that "He is not here" even today. That is, that Jesus isn't present with us in the church service on Sundays. Or, when things go wrong, that Jesus isn't with us any longer and doesn't care for us. But none of this is true. Whenever Christians gather to hear the good news of Christ's death and resurrection for our sins, Jesus *is* present. He *is* here. He continues to care for you. Jesus promises, "Behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Every Sunday is a little Easter. This Sunday is the big one. Jesus isn't in the tomb. He is risen!

As We Gather

Though Christmas may be our favorite, Paul reminds us that Easter is of "first importance." If Christ had not arisen, our hope would be still locked in the tomb. Because He is risen, just as He said, we have hope of our own resurrection from the dead and look forward to the life everlasting, which death cannot touch. We come here today not simply to remember an event but to rejoice in the future made possible for us because of what happened. Before the world we confess that Jesus' resurrection is not a hope but a fact witnessed by more than five hundred



resurrection is not a hope but a fact witnessed by more than five hundred and on that fact God has built a future for us—one we anticipate now even as we wait to see it fulfilled.

Sermon "Astonished" *Mark* 16:1–8

Introduction:

Salome, Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Joses wake up early Sunday morning to go to the tomb of Jesus. They do so in order to finish the anointing of Jesus' body. They hadn't had enough time to properly prepare Jesus' body for burial after His crucifixion.

I can't say that they were afraid to go to the tomb. Oh, they may have the fear that we experience when we first visit the grave of a loved one. The sting of death is still very raw in our hearts. We are afraid of the tears and the pain that comes with visiting ones loved ones grave. Yet, there is no danger or risk to life and limb. We are just afraid of reliving the pain and the intense grief that comes with mourning the separation from a loved one.

The Scriptures do reveal that these women were concerned about the proper burial of a loved one and an obstacle that stood in their way. Who will roll away the stone?

They saw were Jesus was laid. They saw the stone rolled into place. Now, that stone had to be rolled back. Who was going to do it for them?

Worry, concern filled their hearts. But the unexpected would frighten them.

I. The Unexpected

Up ahead they saw that the stone was already rolled back. The grave was open. I imagine their hearts sank. They were not expecting this. What happened? Mary Magdalene would later reveal the fear the came into her heart. Someone had taken the body of Jesus.

We know that they were afraid. And when they looked into the tomb there they saw angels. This filled their hearts with fear. We know this because the angel said to them, "Don't be alarmed."

Think about it. Their intent is to finish burying Jesus in a proper manner. Now, they are seeing angels. It is too much to process.

The unexpected seems to have such an effect on us all. The death of a loved one, the sudden loss of health, the loss of a job and even our homes can cause us to be afraid. This past year has been filled with the unexpected. Who among us knew what 2020 would bring?

This time last year we announced that all Lenten, Holy Week and Easter services were cancelled. Most of us knew in the back of our minds that snow, ice and floods have cancelled services in the past. But who knew that a pandemic would happen in our life time.

For some, this past year was scary. Who would become infected? Who would be hospitalized? Who would die? We were afraid to go to stores, to restaurants and even to church. There was a danger that existed and we didn't want anything unexpected to happen to us.

We called on Christ to watch over us and to deliver us. Yet, we struggled with the unexpected and looked to Christ to be are stable rock, our unchanging hope in life and in all our struggles.

II. The Unbelievable Message

What the angel said next didn't seem to calm the fears of the women. "You seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here. He has risen."

Scriptures does not record for us a joyous outburst of praise on the part of the women. They are stunned. Scriptures said they were astonished. "Speechless" is the word that comes to mind. They were not processing what they were seeing and hearing.

Shouldn't good news move us to shout for joy? Shouldn't there be dancing in the street? Palm branches waving? People sing, "Hosanna in the Highest." Instead these women trembled at the new and were afraid.

They were afraid to tell others. The angel had instructed them to go and tell Peter and the disciples. This they did. They didn't know what would happen to them and the disciples when this news got out to the populous. They didn't know what was going to happen next. And besides, who would believe them. The message is too great, too vast to comprehend.

Think about the message you and I carry today. Who in the world will believe that a man who was crucified did so to pay the price of our sins? Who in the world will believe that a man on a cross suffered the wrath of God in our place? Who in the world will believe that the death of a man would win for us everlasting life?

Now, add on top of this, that this man raised Himself up from the dead and would ascend into heaven to sit at the right of His Father. Who is going to believe this as we so dearly cling to for the hope of our salvation? Who is going to believe that this man is also the Son of God, begotten of the Father from eternity?

The message is too unbelievable. It cannot be comprehended by our minds. And this can make us afraid of telling others. Except, we know that the Holy Spirit has worked in our hearts through the Word to create such a faith and He will work in the hearts of those who will listen to this most unbelievable message.

Conclusion:

In less than two months after this day, the disciples and these women whose hearts were filled with fear would boldly confess Jesus to be the Messiah, the Savior of the world. The unexpected has become the ultimate truth. Doubt would be replaced with certainty. Fear would be replaced with hope.

Our hearts are filled once again with the good news of Christ's death and resurrection. The fears of the past year are being dismissed. Our hope, our stability, our peace and comfort lies in these words. "He is risen."
