In preparation for Proper 7 – June 21, 2020

It was amazing that the young woman remained alive. Her entire body had not only been lacerated but even smashed. She was Blandina, a servant girl of the second century in what we would today call France.

Blandina was among the early martyrs of the church. She died confessing her faith in Jesus Christ.

Her tormenters found themselves at a loss. They had tortured her from morning to evening, and frankly did not know what more they could do to her. For her part, Blandina said, "I am a Christian, and nothing wicked happens among us."

Jesus said (in a passage that will be read at our church this Sunday), "do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell" (Matthew 10:28). Jesus did not want the lives of His people to be dominated by the paralyzing fear of other human beings. The One to be feared is God.

Sinners have good reason to be terrified at God's enduring wrath, but Jesus came to offer Himself as a ransom for all. He won forgiveness from God for poor helpless sinners. Now everyone can have a fear of God that is tempered by His forgiveness: "With you is forgiveness," the Psalmist prayed to God, "that you may be feared" (Psalm 130:4). This forgiveness-based fear of God drives out all other fears. In fact, it makes a person truly morally useful in this topsy-turvy world.

However much Blandina's accusers and tormenters tried to twist reality, she knew the truth. It gave her the courage to say, while enduring great pain: "I am a Christian, and nothing wicked happens among us."

Blandina knew who to fear. How about you?

AS WE GATHER

It should be no surprise, for the Lord warned them from the beginning. To follow Christ, to live our Baptism, to be a Christian will not be a life of ease, peace, and abundance, but rather one of trouble and contradiction. All the apostles and prophets found this to be true. Jeremiah's complaint is repeated by all who have discovered the Christian life is but warfare between life and death. Because Jesus gave



Himself to the defeat of the devil and our spiritual slavery by letting it all have its way with Him to the cross, all who believe are freed and made participants in newness of life by simple faith in this grace and mercy of God for us. Jesus says three times today, "Do not be afraid," so now even with the prophet's complaint repeated, we can rejoice with him, "Sing to the Lord! Give praise to the Lord!"

 12 Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal bodies, to make you obey their

passions. ¹³Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness. ¹⁴For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace. ¹⁵What then? Are we to sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! ¹⁶Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? ¹⁷But thanks be to God, that you who were once slaves of sin have become obedient from the heart to the standard of teaching to which you were committed, ¹⁸and, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. ¹⁹I am speaking in human terms, because of your natural limitations. For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to lawlessness leading to more lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness leading to sanctification. ²⁰When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. ²¹But what fruit were you getting at that time from the things of which you are now ashamed? 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Sermon: "Speaking in Human Terms"

Based on Romans 6:12-23

Introduction:

Human words are inadequate to describe God, His love, His mercy, His grace and forgiveness. Yet, God the Holy Spirit moved the prophets and apostles to write this great mystery in human terms. God comes down to us and in our own language and limited understanding God proclaims and works in our heart His grace and His forgiveness to life everlasting.

So, in order to understand the need to battle sin and how deadly it is in our lives, God the Holy Spirit led Paul to describe this battle in terms associated with presenting a sacrifice in the temple and the institution of slavery.

I. Presentation

The children of Israel would bring their sacrifices to the Temple in Jerusalem. They would present it to the priest who in turn would then perform the sacrifice. This was to be done by the Children of Israel as a way of showing they worshiped Yahweh as their God. So, when the children of Israel would go to the altars of Baal and make their sacrifices, they were saying, "Baal is our god." This was idolatry. And it was deadly. Because it not only brought the wrath of God upon the people, it was a rejection of a good and gracious God who had saved their lives.

Now, when Paul speaks about presenting our bodies to the Lord, the imagery is the same. When you and I in faith in Christ present ourselves to God as a sacrifice of thanksgiving, we are acknowledging that He is our God. We present our bodies to the High Priest, Jesus Christ, with the understanding that He will use our bodies in service to Him and to the Father in heaven. We present our bodies in gratitude for the forgiveness and salvation He has won for us. We ask God to use us in such a way that we hallow His name and that His will be done.

Yet, our sinful flesh wants us to acknowledge ourselves as God. We can recognize this when we see sin within ourselves and in our lives. We understand our sinful flesh wants us to use our bodies in service to itself. We understand it to be idolatry.

With this understanding comes the understanding that idolatry in this form is also deadly. It is a rejection of the good and gracious God who saved us. It is a move toward pushing the true living God out of our lives. And, if He is out of our lives, then sin will reign within us. This will lead us to death. By ourselves we have no mastery over sin.

II. Slaves

This brings us to a term we are not comfortable with, slaves. Paul is led by the Holy Spirit to use this term that is within our understanding. He is not justifying the institution of slavery. Yet, it accurately describes the nature of sin within us. While Paul uses it to describe the reign of a good and gracious God that is within our hearts and lives.

Throughout history people have enslaved others. Usually, it was done to show superior strength over another nation. Egypt had enslaved Israel to show that they were the superior power in the land. Rome had enslaved Israel in the same

manner. The Israelites were enslaved to help another nation become a powerful worldwide power.

Paul speaks of this type of slavery. One has no freedom because of someone more powerful has control over one's life. And this is what Paul means when He speaks about being a slave to sin. It controls us. We do not control sin. It has mastery over our lives. It directs our thoughts, our words and our actions. Paul would write of this struggle in the next chapter of Romans. The good I want to do I do not do. The evil I do not want to do. That I do.

We are to understand that our sinful flesh will reign within us unless someone else stronger comes, conquers sin, and becomes our master. And that someone is Christ Jesus.

We need help. We cannot conquer sin on our own. We need someone to come and save us. And that is what Christ has done. He took our sin to the cross with Him. There at the cross, He took sin's power away. He died the death that our sins had earned. He paid the wages of our sins.

Sin has no power over us. This doesn't mean we go on sinning because it can't hurt us. No. We know it can hurt us. We know it can bring death to us. This is why we go to Christ. We bring our sin to Him and ask that He continues to reign in our hearts.

When we repent of our sins, it is more than just wiping the slate clean. No, we are asking Christ to rule in our hearts like that of a good and gracious master rules over his beloved slaves. And we want the Holy Spirit to work in our hearts that we approach Christ in the manner of a slave. Not my will be done, but yours.

It is out of gratefulness that we offer ourselves as His slaves. He has saved us from death. He has given us eternal life, that is to say, He has given us life. He has freed us from a most horrible slave driver. He has even made us His children. It gratefulness we offer ourselves as slaves to be used by Him in service to the household of God and for the furthering of His kingdom.

Conclusion:

The temple no longer exists and will not be re-erected by God for the receiving of thanks offerings. By His grace, we are able to do this by the praise, honor and good works we offer to Him daily. The institution of slavery should continue to be banned by nations. Yet, we submit ourselves to God through His Son Jesus Christ in gratefulness for the salvation He has provided us.

Human language is limiting. We will not fully know the full extent of God's goodness and grace until we see Him face to face in heaven. We have a good idea though. God has come down to us to implant in our hearts this understanding of His grace and to trust in Him as good and loving King.
