¹⁴For the body does not consist of one member but of many. ¹⁵If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. ¹⁶And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. ¹⁷If the whole body were an eye, where would be the sense of hearing? If the whole body were an ear, where would be the sense of smell? ¹⁸But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. ¹⁹If all were a single member, where would the body be? ²⁰As it is, there are many parts, yet one body.

²¹The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." ²²On the contrary, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, ²³and on those parts of the body that we think less honorable we bestow the greater honor, and our unpresentable parts are treated with greater modesty, ²⁴which our more presentable parts do not require. But God has so composed the body, giving greater honor to the part that lacked it, ²⁵that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another. ²⁶If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together.

²⁷Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. ²⁸And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then miracles, then gifts of healing, helping, administrating, and various kinds of tongues. ²⁹Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? ³⁰Do all possess gifts of healing? Do all speak with tongues? Do all interpret? ³¹But earnestly desire the higher gifts.

SERMON "Christ Also Has Just One Body" 1 Corinthians 12:12-31a

Introduction:

Last week I mentioned how there is one holy Christian Church on earth. Paul continues to describe this one holy invisible Christian Church. He is led by the Holy Spirit to describe it as a body. He describes it as a human body something you and I are familiar with.

We know how the body works. There is a head. There is the torso. Arms and legs are attached. There are the organs such as the heart, the stomach and so on. The body has eyes, ears and so many parts that it takes a number of semesters of anatomy classes to learn, memorizes and know how each part functions.

The body is complicated enough that a one could research the body for a life time and not learn it all, simple enough that a child can play "Toes, knees, hips, shoulders and head."

The illustration of the body is not lost on describing the one holy invisible Christian Church on earth, that is, the Body of Christ.

I. Each Part Important

Now each part of the body is important with the head being the most important. Sever the head and the whole body dies. If Christ were ever to separate Himself from the Church, the church dies. For He is the one who keeps the Church united. He has redeemed her, purchased her with His holy precious blood and moves Her in the directions that is best for Her and for the furthering of His kingdom.

The temptation for us is to think that it is we the body are the ones who unites us in service to our Lord. We think that if we can just love each other enough, get along with each other and work at being united we can to a better job of servicing our Lord.

The truth is this. Christ is who unites us. He is the one who works in our hearts to see each other as important. He is the one who by His Holy Spirit has brought the Church together. Not by giving us a common task but through Baptism we were brought into this one holy invisible Christian Church.

It has been His work to work through us to do those things that are pleasing in the sight of the Father. It has been Him alone who makes each part of the Church, His body, important. It is Christ who battles racism, elitism or prejudice in our hearts. He is the one who opens our eyes to see how important each person is in the Church, from the unborn to the centenarian, from the weakest to the strongest, from the feeble to able, each one is important and necessary.

II. Each Part Necessary

Yes, necessary. This is why Christ appoints first the apostles, second the prophets and third the teachers. Christ spoke through the Apostles and the prophets so that the Word of God would be carried to His people. They along with the teachers were to teach the people the Word of God. This important job was given so that all who hear would believe and be saved.

He then gave others roles in the Church to support this work. This was played out in the book of Acts when the apostles, the disciples, saw that they needed to center on the preaching and teaching of the Word. The work of caring for the poor and widows could be given to another part of the body. Seven men full of the Spirit were selected to do such work. The most famous of them was Stephen.

Everyone in the Church is necessary. We cannot say to one or the other we have no need of you. No can rightfully say they are not necessary and then step away from the body. We are not to make such judgments. It is Christ who has declared each part of the body as being important and necessary.

Conclusion:

As I mentioned above, we are tempted as parts of the body to think that we can apart from the head unite the body. We must always look to Christ for this task. When we read this passage we are drawn to confess our sins when we think, speak, or act toward another member of the body of Christ as if they are not necessary or important. We ask for God's forgiveness and that He change our minds and battle any prejudism, racism or the feeling of superiority in our hearts. We ask that He strengthen us to see each and every Christian as a part of the Body of Christ. And we pray that Christ would resolve any and all differences that divide us.

Christ has only one body, and that is the Holy Christian Church – the communion of saints.
