SERMON *"Focus On Rejoicing" Philippians* 4:4–7

Introduction:

Is God being realistic when He commands us to rejoice? There is not much in the world today that we lead us to always rejoice. Therefore, He commands us to rejoice in the Lord, not in what the world offers.

Yet, we live in the world. We have families, friends, neighbors and other people in our lives. There is the needs of others and those who need our care. How can we be always rejoicing when the sting of death lies heavy in our hearts.

What God offers to us is not a distraction from the sorrows of life. He doesn't offer us an escape to a happy place in our hearts. He offers us help and a way to face the sorrows and difficulties of life.

I. Letting our requests be known to God

He invites us strongly to make our requests known to Him. He has commanded us to call upon

Him in the day of trouble. And He has promised to deliver us.

When sorrows and difficulties fill our hearts, we do turn to God for help. We will ask Him to deliver us, a loved one or even a stranger from the troubles of life. This is good and proper. It should become our habit. That is to say, it is the first thing that we do when we face any situation in our lives.

Paul includes that we make these requests with thanksgiving. Again, not as a distraction to the problem, but because it leads us to the comfort we desire and the solution we need.

We thank a person for doing something for us. They had offered assistance or help, provided us with a needed item or gift. It made our lives a little brighter or easier.

In the same way, when call upon God in our day of trouble, we thank Him for His omniscience, omnipotence and omnipresence. We thank Him for knowing our situation far better than we ourselves do. We thank Him for His strength, wisdom and power to deliver us, our loved ones or that stranger we have included in our prayers. We thank Him for being there when we needed Him the most.

II. The peace of God which is ours already

Does this drive away sadness, depression or the sting of death? At times, most often it battles against these things.

Sadness can remain. But there is peace in knowing that someone greater than ourselvies is taking care of the request we have made. We know that there was someone who listened and could, and would act our behalf. The sadness remains while peace fills the hearts.

Depression that is more than sadness can remain. We feel helpless and not able to do anything. Yet, we ask God to move us as He sees fit to use us in caring or resolving the situation we face. In some case, when the depression does not leave, it may be a sign that their may be a psychological problem that needs medical attention. The peace that comes is the strength to go and seek help.

And the sting of death, never fully is gone. We still caring a sinful nature. The sting is there because we are still sinful. And death is still foreign to us. This is to say that we were not created to die. Death is the wages of sin. And so the sting remains. The peace is that in Christ we have the hope of salvation. There is the forgiveness of sins. There is the strength of faith to know and accept things that are out of our control and must be left up to God, alone to handle.

Conclusion:

When Christ commands us to rejoice always, He doesn't leave it up to us to work out our problems and sorrows that interfere with joy and peace. He has given us the right and the freedom to call upon Him in the day of trouble. He has already placed His peace within our hearts when He brought us to faith. He reassures that what we need to rejoice always He has

provided us. Rejoice in the Lord for He is good and His mercy endures forever.
