Lent 3

Merriam-Webster defines zeal as "eagerness and ardent interest in pursuit of something." In the reading from John's Gospel that we'll hear this coming Sunday, we hear a bit about the zeal of Jesus. He has zeal for His Father's house; that is, the Temple in Jerusalem.

Jesus has such zeal that He forces out the people who were selling animals for the required sacrifices, as well as the money-changers. They had made the sacrificial worship of God into a system of transaction. They were adding some element of corruption or of profit to a wonderful gift of God.

Jesus' zeal truly extends beyond the house of God. It extends to the whole fallen creation of God. Jesus cared about the Temple being kept pure because it was a preview of His own pure body, the true temple that would be destroyed on Good Friday and then three days later raised up on Easter. This, the death and resurrection of Jesus, was the most wonderful of God's gifts. God, in His love and grace, gave Jesus as a sacrifice to take away the sin of the world.

That zeal of Christ for all to be saved now extends beyond Himself to His own followers. Take, for example, the Apostle Paul. He is so zealous to speak to everyone about the wonderful gift of

salvation in Jesus Christ crucified that he's willing to be considered a fool. "The word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing," Paul writes. "But to us who are being saved it is the power of God."

To those who are blind to God's ways, the zeal of Jesus to offer Himself as a pure sacrifice for the sins of the world is foolishness. But as for those who know that every man is sinful and unclean? Well, for every one of them – hopefully including you – the zeal of Jesus to die and rise for all mankind is nothing but a reason to cry out with thanks and praise to God.

As We Gather

When the Israelites were encamped by Mount Sinai, just out of slavery in Egypt and far from the Promised Land, God wisely gave them the Ten Commandments. They are engraved in our historic churches and capitol buildings. Their perfect demands require a Savior for us. Jesus was so jealous for God's Law that He cleansed the temple before cleansing us of our sin by giving the temple of His body. In His wisdom, God did what we could not: He kept His own Law for us and then chose us to be the Body of



Christ today. None of us has kept the commandments; we and our spiritual ancestors reflect our weaknesses in faith and action. But in the process, God's wisdom shows forth: When we are weak, He is strong. Today is a day to boast about God's grace and His Son, Christ crucified, the power and wisdom of God.

It is as if He said, "I became man, and all that I do and suffer is for your good. As a pledge of this, I give you My body to eat."

In the same way also He took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." Again, it is as if He said, "I have had mercy on you by taking into Myself all your iniquities. I give Myself into death, shedding My blood to obtain grace and forgiveness of sins, and to comfort and establish the new testament, which gives forgiveness and everlasting salvation. As a pledge of this, I give you My blood to drink."

Therefore, whoever eats this bread and drinks this cup, confidently believing this Word and promise of Christ, dwells in Christ and Christ in him and has eternal life. We should also do this in remembrance of Him, showing His death—that He was delivered for our offenses and raised for our justification. Giving Him our most heartfelt thanks, we take up our cross and follow Him and, according to His commandment, love one another as He has loved us. For we are all one bread and one body, even as we are all partakers of this one bread and drink from the one cup.

For just as the one cup is filled with wine of many grapes and one bread made from countless grains, so also we, being many, are one body in Christ. Because of Him, we love one another, not only in word, but in deed and in truth.

May the almighty and merciful God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, by His Holy Spirit, accomplish this in us.

Sermon "I Will Raise It Up" John 2:13–22

Introduction:

Jesus was being questioned as to what authority He had to drive out all these money-changers and sellers of animals. He wasn't a priest. He wasn't one of the temple rulers. He was just a common man off the street.

True, He was no stranger to the temple. He was forty days old when He was presented at the temple as the first born son of Mary and Joseph. He spent three days at the temple when He was twelve. Mary and Joseph searched for Him and found Him at the temple. Jesus was surprised they didn't first go to the temple to find Him. And throughout His ministry Jesus was known to come to the temple. He even declared Himself to the living water at the temple. He was no stranger. The temple was a part of Jesus' life.

I. He designed it

So, now when He saw the temple being misused, the zeal for the temple moved Him to drive out the money changers and the sellers. Was it just an act of an overzealous Israelite? Was it just a member of the congregation going ballistic?

No, this was His Father's house. It was a house designed by His Heavenly Father. He commanded Moses to take skilled workers and build the tabernacle and items that would be used in the daily sacrifices plus those special days of sacrifice.

Later He would give King Solomon permission to build the temple in Jerusalem. And destroy it at the time of the Babylonian Captivity. The children of Israel had turned away from God and in a sense God had to cleanse the temple, the city and the land.

The temple that Jesus cleansed was the temple King Herod built. It followed the same design as the tabernacle that God had designed. King Herod's motive was not of devotion to the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. He delighted in building buildings that reflected his glory not the glory of God.

It something we need to battle ourselves. The care of this building is not to make us look good and attractive to the community. It is to provide a place of prayer and worship for us to use to the glory of God.

So, when Jesus saw the temple being misused, He cleansed it under the authority of being the Son of God. And He would show this authorization by His resurrection.

II. He rose from the dead

46 years it took to build the temple, Herod's temple as it is referred to today. A lot of time and money went into it. But less then forty years later, the temple would be leveled. I am not aware of how long it took the Romans to dismantle the temple. But it no longer stands.

Jesus refers to Himself as the temple. "Destroy this temple and I will raise it up in three days," a clear reference to His resurrection. Jesus showed that He is the Son of God. He rose from the dead on the third day. He is the Savior, the Messiah and our Lord. He has authority to cleanse the temple because it represented Him and what He would do. He would be the Lamb of God who was sacrificed for the sins of the world. He would be the High Priest who would offer Himself as the sacrifice for the iniquities of this world. He would the burnt offering that alone paid for the transgressions of this world.

His resurrection is proof that His sacrifice is sufficient to pay for our sins. It is proof positive that He is the Son of God. It is proof that He has the authority to cleanse the temple. It is proof that there will be no temple in heaven. Jesus is the temple and the Lamb who will be served day and night by those who are gathered before Him in heaven.

Conclusion:

One might quote Jesus by saying (tongue-in-check), "It is my Father's house. I can do as I please with it." Well it pleased the LORD to cleanse the temple and keep it a house of prayer. It was meant to draw people to an understanding that God dwelt among them and that He gladly forgave them their sins for the sake of the sacrifice His Son would make.

May this be our comfort that when Jesus says to us, "Your sins are forgiven," He does have the authority to announce this to us, for He rose from the dead and is our Lord and Savior.


