In preparation for Proper 17 – August 30, 2020

Why does Jesus matter right now? With a global pandemic still in progress, tension and unrest filling society, and uncertainty looming over the future, people sometimes wonder what difference Jesus might make.

What did Jesus Himself say? *In words we will hear in our church service on Sunday*, “Whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake will find it” (Matthew 16:25).

That’s bold. Not long before this, Simon Peter had acknowledged that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God (Matthew 16:16). Well, Jesus was now speaking like Someone of such importance! You cannot remain neutral about Him.

Furthermore, we ourselves are hardly neutral. Human beings do not sit at point zero on some scale, waiting to jump into the acceptable or unacceptable column before God. The whole human race has been estranged from its Creator, and that shows up in many ways: evil outside ourselves, weakness and failure within ourselves, alienation from life, meaninglessness, disobedience, and mortality. In our sin, we die.

Really, there is no rescuing ourselves. “Whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake will find it.”

Why does Jesus matter? He, the Man Who is also God, lost His life for us. He gave Himself as a ransom for all.

You go with Jesus from death to life in baptism. “We were buried . . . with Him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life” (Romans 6:4).

Because of Jesus there is redemption, reconciliation, and transformation. He gives forgiveness and hope and resurrection and life. These things matter. He brings them to you.

How does that sound?

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Sermon “Dealing With People”

Romans 12:9–21

Introduction:

We have to deal with people day in and day out. Sometimes, hopefully most of the times, it is a pleasant experience. When the sinful nature, we all possess, gets in the way, it is not a pleasant experience. In fact, when escalated to the fullest extent it can lead to murder, war, defamation of character and gossip.

Our nature is to love myself and that's it. Love myself. Take care of number one, me. And strike back at anyone who would hurt me. That is the obstacle that you and I as Christians have to battle and deal with in our lives.

God commands us to love our neighbor as ourselves. And we fail at it. Now, God has called us to repent of such sin. He leads us to seek His grace and forgiveness. Through His grace He gives us strength to deal with people as Paul has described in our text today. God offers His forgiveness and strength so that we do not fall into despair. He calls us to repent and receive His grace as an act of love on His part toward us so that we can offer love and deeds of good works to others.

I. With Genuine Love

Through the Apostle Paul, God the Holy Spirit teaches us to offer genuine love to one another. Not a moralistic love based on trying to keep a commandment. Moralism in this fashion is still selfish love. It is more about me than serving the other person.

Genuine love is having a deep concern for others. It is a deep gratitude for the presence of the other person in our lives. It is a willingness to sacrifice and even die for the other person.

Genuine love is not being politically correct. Loving someone doesn't mean we stop hating sin and the breaking of God's law. In fact, as our faith in Christ grows we hate our own sin and in

turn hate the sin of the world.

Genuine love leads us to be humble when dealing with others. Honor them as God has honored us by calling us His Children. This grace of God keeps us from being self-righteous and haughty toward others. For the evil others do is equal to the evil I do which I hate.

II. With Good

Thus we are moved to pray for those who persecute us, speak evil of us or wish us harm. We act totally contrary to the ways of the world does in dealing with people.

This doesn't mean that in every situation we are going to be able to negotiate. Paul will speak later on the role of government to punish the evildoer and praise those who do good works. But, our first move is not to strike back with words and fists. Where we can get along, we are to practice living in harmony with one another. And where we face evil in our world, we are to use good to overcome it.

Conclusion:

In dealing with people, we are to keep our eyes on Christ, praying that His will be our will. His approach in dealing with evil be our way also. He has given us His grace and forgiveness. We pray that we forgive those who have trespassed against as He has forgiven us our trespasses.

Genuine love moves us to do this in service to God and to others. We do it not to receive forgiveness that would be self-centered on our part. We desire to do it because we have been the recipient of a greater love and grace, God's.
