**SERMON** "The Safer Commandments to Follow" Mark 7:1–13

#### Introduction:

What is the motivation behind keeping the commandments of men and of God? Is it love? Or, is it to have our own way?

#### I. The Commandments of Men

This is the point that Christ is making with the Pharisees. They were not questioning the disciples' actions because they were concerned about their souls. They were not questioning their actions at all. The Pharisees were attacking Jesus. They wanted to discredit Him. And Jesus calls them on it.

The Pharisees were not worried about right and wrong. They were not worried about if the disciples had sinned in such a way that they needed to repent. They wanted to make Jesus look bad in the sight of the people so they would stop following Him.

Their hearts were filled with hatred and jealousy toward Jesus. They were not concerned about following the Law of Moses or even God's law. They wanted to show Jesus to be a heretic, a false prophet, a false Messiah.

They asked Jesus why His disciples didn't want follow the traditions of the elders. Jesus more or less said, "Let's talk about your precious traditions." Jesus points out that they had many traditions. Many of them were good. The washing of hands, cups and couches. This was good.

But they had become law, in this sense. It was considered an offense to the religious community and to God if these washings were not observed. A person was charged guilty of sin if they

failed to wash properly. What was to help people understand the importance of being clean in the sight of God, became a burden because of the tradition man imposed. Traditions that were created to help people honor God became loopholes for people to cover up their greed.

Christ says to them that their hearts are far away from God. God gave His Law to guard and protect His people. It was out of His love for His people that the Law is given.

#### II. The Commandments of God

Exodus chapter twenty records for us the giving of the Law to Moses and the Israelite. God identifies Himself as Yahweh, God of grace. He is the God who delivered Israel from the bondage of slavery. It is in this frame that we consider the commandments of God.

The commandments of God are not put in place so that God can maintain a rule over us. He has established that by creating us and redeeming us through His Son Jesus Christ. He did not give His Law to oppress and control a people, but rather that they would be a light to the world. They were to be a beacon to call the world to their Savior. He not give His law to settle disputes but rather to guide His people in knowing what are loving thoughts, words and actions.

Even now, the Church is tempted to use the love of God as a loophole. Even in the Church, people have turned away from the commandments of God to follow the commandments of men. The same attitude can still exist today. The commandments of men supersede the commandments of God. What God declares as a sinful lust, desire, thought, word or action, man declares to be an act of love and embracing diversity.

And even here in calling people back to the Word of God, the Church may be more concerned about how She looks in the sight of society. In attempts to appear pure and holy, we fail to help one fallen into sin. Rather than offering the gift of repentance, we are tempted to shun a person. Instead of encourage and counseling a person to fight temptation, we condemn and make rules that try to manipulate a person into obedience.

#### Conclusion:

When the Church confronts a person fallen into sin, She must first make sure that a sin has been committed and not someone doing something against tradition. She must approach the person with a deep concern for their soul and salvation. She must pray and encourage the person to seek the free grace of God and the gift of forgiveness Christ has won for us through repentance. And She must be patient enough to walk with them through their struggle.

The Pharisees did not care. They only wanted to judge and condemn. We must be on guard also over our own hearts that we do not confront a person in sin or so called sin only to punish and even show ourselves to be more righteous.

We continually seek the grace of God for the forgiveness of our own sin; live in the peace and assurance that we have been forgiven; and reach out to others to serve and help them as our thanks to God for the salvation He has given us.
