WORSHIP FOLDER TWENTIETH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST—PROPER 23

Blessing the Day—Noontime/Afternoon October 9 & 10, 2021

AS WE GATHER

God's people are called to live each hour of the day following the example set by Jesus. Many Christian people find opportunity for personal devotion at the beginning of the day or as the day draws to its close. Yet all day long there are occasions for praying, praising, and giving thanks. In the formal worship sequence observed in structured Christian communities such as monasteries, a noontime service called Sext, named for noon—the sixth hour of the day, provided a midpoint for a day filled with devotion. The psalmist affirms that

every hour is a good hour to bless the Lord, writing: "My tongue shall tell of Your righteousness and of Your praise all the day long" (Psalm 35:28).

ORDER OF DIVINE SERVICE 1 LSB 151

SERMON "Loving Concern" Mark 10:17–22

Introduction:

This young man that came to see Jesus was sincere. He wasn't looking to justify himself in the sight of Christ. He truly wanted to know what one must do to inherit eternal life. We know this because of the humble position he took before Jesus. He knelt before Jesus and addressed Jesus as "Good Teacher."

Christ knew the heart of this young man. He perceived that this young man was trying to do what was needed to inherit eternal life. And Jesus saw that this young man was attempting to perform the law in order to inherit eternal life.

This is why Jesus commented on the address, "Only God is good." This is true. Only God can be perfect. No person on earth can be perfect.

It was out of love and concern for this young man's soul that Jesus wanted him to know that it was only through Him, Jesus, can one inherit eternal life.

I. He gives us all that we need

Jesus continues on this point of perfection. "You know the commandments." Interestingly He lists the second table of the commandments which deal with ones neighbors. Jesus is not challenging the young man's love for God. It is evident that this young man loved God and wanted to obey Him.

But the obstacle to this young man's love for God lied in his love for wealth. This would be revealed to him in helping the poor. We are not saying this man was stingy. He may have contributed to the poor in some way or form. But to inherit eternal life by being perfect is beyond one's ability.

Jesus shows this to the young. He says to the young man to sell all that he has and then give it to the poor. Such giving and sacrificing would be putting Christ first above all things and one will have the treasures in heaven.

It is a reminder to us that this earth cannot offer us more than what Christ has given to us. He has given us treasurers in heaven, a place in heaven. Nothing here on earth is worth clinging to at the expense of losing what Christ has given us when He forgave us our sins and made us children of God.

Yet, it is hard for us to give us earthly things. It is hard for to part with what God has blessed us. The one thing that helps us let loose of the things of earth is that we do have the treasures in heaven. And this helps us by making the things on earth less attractive and needful in our lives.

II. He calls us to follow Him

Jesus tells the young man to follow Him. Here is where eternal life is inherited. It is in Christ that we receive the greatest gift of all, forgiveness of sin, salvation and eternal life. It is holding Christ first in our lives that we are able to see what is good and right in His sight.

To follow Christ is to believe in Him as Lord and Savior. His life, His death, His resurrection and His ascension are what have secured for us our eternal life. To follow Christ is an acknowledgement of this.

It is important that we do not see our actions, thoughts or even our words as a requirement in earning eternal life. We acknowledge that we are sinful. We have sinned against God and our neighbor in thought, word and deed. We look to Christ for forgiveness and the washing away of our sins. We ask Him to make us appear holy in the sight of our heavenly Father. And He does.

Conclusion:

The young man went away sad. He loved his wealth. Did he later do as Christ said and returned to follow Christ? The Scriptures do not reveal this.

But for you and me, we truly want to serve God and live according to His word. And so we continue to ask, "Lord, do not let anything in my life or in this world become an obstacle in following you."
