In preparation for Proper 26 – November 1, 2020

This Sunday is "All Saints' Day." The Christian church has observed All Saints' Day for centuries.

Society doesn't have "saints" anymore, but it has heroes. Leading figures in politics, sports, or entertainment come to mind. Plus, an awareness is developing about "ordinary heroes" all around us: first responders, medical workers, also grocery clerks and delivery personnel, to name a few. We cannot honor them enough. With them, maybe we come as close as we get to having saints.

And we grow bitterly disappointed if they let us down. Living people can lose high-profile jobs, and it's almost as if some of the deceased have to be wiped from memory. Woe be to the heroes whose "halos" slip. We expected something different from them. We wanted them to be . . . saints?!

Perhaps it will surprise us nowadays, but the Gospel lesson that the church began reading centuries ago for All Saints' Day is really not about such halos for humans. It is the beginning of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. *It will be read in our church service on Sunday.* The first words out of the Lord's mouth were: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 5:3).

The last thing the poor in spirit do is to celebrate their own accomplishments or self-made standing, especially before God. Beggars, they look to Him for everything, especially in the realm of the spirit. And boy, do they know it!

Jesus said these people are blessed because God acts for them. He gives them gifts that can have only because Jesus died for them and rose again. Theirs is the kingdom of heaven, already now but for eternity too.

All who have God-given faith in Christ are "poor in spirit." They are saints, because of Him.



Prayer for Blessing on the Word

Sermon "What Kind of Love" 1 John 3:1-3

Introduction:

"God loves you." Is that a generalization or a fact? Is it something we say or is it true? In good times, we have no problem with this statement. It is in the bad times, that we have our doubts?

God definitely wants us to know that He loves us. And that this is most certainly true. Yet, we struggle with the way in which He pours out His love toward us.

I. By His Declaration – His Word

We hear from the Bible that God so love the world. It is written down for us. As I said before, we can easily believe this when things are going well for us in our lives. When we are happy and joyful, it is easy to think and thank God for His love. He has made our lives a delight and it is obvious that God is smiling down upon us.

But when sin, sickness, sorrows and death enters into our lives, it becomes increasingly difficult to believe that God still loves us. Why is He allowing all these horrible feelings and events to happen? Is He angry with us? Is He turning away from us? Does He now despise us and want nothing to do with us? If He does still love us, He sure has a funny way of showing it.

The fact is He still does. He still calls us His children. And that is who we are. That hasn't changed though the world may crumb around us, though sin and death remains close to us, He still loves us.

See what kind of love He has given us. Even though we deserve His anger and wrath, He gives us mercy, grace, forgiveness and love. Even though we have rebelled and sinned against Him, He still calls us His children and gathers us into His presence. Even though we are guilty of sin, He sent His Son Jesus Christ to carry that guilt for us, and by dying on the cross paid the wages of sin with His own death.

It is a funny way of showing His love to us. He sacrificed His Son as the sin offering for us. And sprinkling us with His blood, He washes us clean of our sins. And with His Word and water, He declares us to be His children. This is not a generalization. It is a declaration heard in heaven and in our hearts as we hear His Word, are baptized and receive His body and blood in the Lord's Supper.

II. By What We Will Be When He Returns

And if that is not enough, He goes even farther in promising to make us like His Son when He returns. This means, we will someday be holy and perfect in every way. We will have a perfect love for God and for others. We will serve Him as quickly and willingly as His Son did. We will be without sin, sickness and death will never draw near us again.

Again, this is the love God has given us. We have not earned it. We do not merit it. There is nothing we have offered or done that would force God to do this for us. It is purely out of Fatherly divine goodness and mercy that He has done this for us.

He raised Jesus from the dead and seated Him at His right hand. He will raise us on the last day and with all the saints, that is, all those who have died in the faith will be gathered into His presence and the presence of the Lamb who sits on the throne.

Conclusion:

If this was just a statement on God's part, it may be hard and difficult for us to believe it. But God pours out His love through His Word and Sacrament. The Holy Spirit works in our hearts convincing us to cling to this truth. It is not by cognitive powers that we believe this. It is the working of God the Holy Spirit in our hearts so that we are comforted by this truth.

He works to drive away all doubt and fear. And finally when we stand before Christ there will be no more doubt. We will see what kind of love our Father in heaven has given us.

God grant you such peace and assurance.


