AS WE GATHER

“What’s in a name?” That simple question begins one of the most memorable quotes from William Shakespeare’s play *Romeo and Juliet*. Through this simple Juliet asks a profound question about how much or how little a name can mean. When God spoke to Moses out of the burning bush, He affirmed the importance of holy name, as He said: “Say this to the people of Israel, ‘The Lord, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you.’ This is My name forever, and thus I am to be remembered throughout all generations” (Exodus 3:15). When God came to earth in person, the name by which was to be known was just as important. In a dream, the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph and spoke of Mary, his betrothed, in this way: “She will bear a son, and you shall call His name Jesus, for he will save His people from their sins” (Matthew 1:21). The name of Jesus, celebrated on this day, is, to those who believe, a source of power and of blessing. It is the greatest of names!







SEQUENCE FOR THE NEW YEAR *Psalm 116:17–19a; 119:57*

P As the New Year begins, there is an opportunity for us to reflect on our lives and to shape them according to our faith. In Old Testament times, the people of God made special vows, promising Him their devotion and seeking His blessing. The psalmist records such a promise with these words:

C **I will offer to You the sacrifice of thanksgiving and call on the name of the LORD. I will pay my vows to the LORD in the presence of all His people, in the courts of the house of the LORD.**

P The Book of Psalms includes another vow that is fitting for each of us as the people of God:

C **The LORD is my portion; I promise to keep Your words.**

P Promises to the Lord may be spoken in the words of a prayer or in the verses of a hymn. John Bode, a British pastor, wrote a hymn for the Confirmation of his daughter and two sons. It is a fitting way to express a vow of faithfulness to the Lord at the start of a new year. Together we sing the first three stanzas.


